

## SCOUTING REACHES ITS CENTENARY



It all began back in 1906, when Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell, now affectionately known as 'B-P', held an experimental camp on Brownsea Island in Dorset, when he brought together 22 boys, some from private schools and some from working class homes. He tried out ideas which had served him in his career as a young army officer in India and later in the Boer War; map making, reconnaissance, observation and woodcraft. The camp lasted for nine days, and was a great success.

In January 1908 Baden-Powell published 'Scouting for Boys', a book issued in fortnightly parts at four pence each. Sales of the book were tremendous. Boys formed themselves into Scout Patrols to try out the ideas. It was an immediate success. Baden-Powell had only intended to provide a method of training boys, something that existing youth organisations such as the Boys' Brigade and the Y.M.C.A. could adopt. To his surprise, youngsters started to organise

themselves into what was destined to become – and is today – the world's largest voluntary youth movement. 'Scouting for Boys' has been translated into more than 35 languages, and today more than 28 million young people in 216 countries

and territories around the world, of every faith, culture and gender, are Scouts.

Girls were also keen to be involved, so Baden-Powell asked his sister Agnes to organise activities for them. The Guide movement was

founded in 1910, and Olave, whom Baden-Powell married in 1912, became Chief Guide.

The first World Scout Jamboree took place at Olympia in London in 1920, with 8,000 participants, and proved that young people of many nations could come together to share common interests and ideals. Since then there have been 17 other World Jamborees at different locations around the world. World Scout Jamborees are now held every four years and, very much like the Olympics, countries vie for the honour of hosting them. As 2007 is the centenary of scouting, the UK was successful in its Jamboree bid, and in July over 40,000 Scouts and Guides from all over the world will come together to celebrate 100 years of Scouting.

The theme of the Jamboree is 'One World, One Promise', a promise to be a friend to all and a brother or sister to every other Scout and Guide. A promise to work for peace and help build a better world.



**Two Guides from Shortlands, Sarah Bunting (back right) and Alys Hudson (front left), have been lucky enough to be selected to attend the Jamboree. # Bethlehem Project Launched

A music therapy project has been launched in a children's orphanage in Bethlehem. Claire Tillotson, Assistant Organist at St. Mary's, Shortlands (right), travelled with 45 clergy from the Diocese of Rochester on a study tour to the Holy Land, and introduced them to a particular way of working with traumatised children through music. Psychologists, social workers and psychotherapists travelled in from the West Bank to take part in a presentation and training morning. One lady travelled through eight security check points to be there!



The clergy then saw at first hand the benefits of working with children through music.

Claire is now setting up a project to continue to provide training for teachers in conflict-torn areas of Palestine and to identify two music students who might be trained in London to return home to Bethlehem as music therapists. It is hoped to seek the support of Parishes in the Diocese as well as an Educational Trust to launch a major appeal to fund their training, and in the meantime this project will benefit from the Lent Lunch on March 31st.

# FAREWELL TO IAN

Ian Brentnall, who has been Organist and Choirmaster at St. Mary's Shortlands since 1999, will be leaving St. Mary's shortly. His last service will be on Easter Day at 10.30am.



Ian has made a significant contribution to the music at St.

Mary's during his time here, not least in the building up of the Choir both in numbers and musical ability, and through the inclusion in the choir's repertoire of items from his ever increasing list of often already published compositions.

The choir has learned to enjoy performing a wide and challenging range of quality music, and has sung Choral Evensong under his direction at Rochester Cathedral. Ian also involved Junior Choir members in awards schemes and courses, and

adults in Diocese run musical events. He was a founder of the popular Bromley Three Choirs Festival, enjoyed each year by St. Mary's, St. Mark's and Bromley Parish Church.

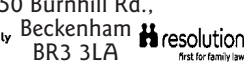

# THE CHURCH OF THE EMPTY TOMB

There is only one church in the world which hosts an empty tomb. It is in Jerusalem, and it is called the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, or the Church of the Resurrection. If you visit any other church you will often find tombs, graveyards, places of remembrance where people are buried. But in Jerusalem one church reminds the world of why we celebrate Easter.

It is important to remember that the roots of Christianity are in

Jerusalem and the Holy Land. Here God came down - Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Here the message of God's love was proclaimed in the teaching and healing of Jesus around Galilee and in Jerusalem - the land was the greenhouse of the gospel and the seminary of the disciples. Here Jesus died; he was put to death by crucifixion, but God showed that death was defeated when Jesus 'arose from the grave' showing the reality of his resurrection by appearing to many

hundreds of witnesses. This is the reason for Christian hope, and why Easter is the greatest of all festivals. It is why, as Christians, we need not fear death. It is why we can look beyond the limitations of this life. We rightly focus on Jerusalem at Easter and the events of 2,000 years ago. But in every church Easter will be celebrated, and we invite you to celebrate at St. Mary's, your local church, the reality of the empty tomb.

### Remembering

#### Peter Milchem

Born in India, one of 6 children, Peter moved to England in 1947 with his family.

He joined the Water Board and worked in the revenue section, and then he decided he would like to train to become a solicitor. He attended evening classes to study for A levels and studied law at King's College, London. He joined the Prudential Insurance Company, qualifying as a solicitor in 1965. He became an officer for the Prudential, retiring in 1990 at the age of 62.

Peter married Jean in 1953 and had four children, Christine, David, Brenda and Barry. He lived life to the full, and was a devoted husband and father.

He was also a regular attender at St Mary's Shortlands, and over the years he was a member of the Men's Society, the PCC, a Sidesman, a member of the two WW's, and he dealt with the church's insurances for many years. He was also a member of Probus and the Caravanning Club.

The many cards and letters received by his family speak of his friendly and warm manner as well as his sense of humour, loyalty and wise advice.

A service of thanksgiving was held at Beckenham Crematorium, conducted by Reverend Alison Newman and attended by many friends, neighbours and church members.

#### Phyllis Jones

Phyllis (Phyl) was born in Fratling, Essex. Her father died when she was 7 and she moved to London with her mother, to start work in accounts at 14, soon moving to Harrods, where she worked for many years. In 1943 she married Thomas Jones (known as Wack), a soldier in the Welsh Guards. After the war they settled in Wales with their 3 daughters, Eileen, Pamela and Hilary, moving to Beckenham when the children had left school.

On retirement Phyl and Wack came to Shortlands. Phyl adored her family and was always a loving support to them all. Tragically, her youngest daughter, Hilary, died in 1999. This was a devastating loss to Phyl, who was by now widowed, and over recent years her health has gradually declined. She will be greatly missed by family and friends, many of whom attended a Service of Thanksgiving at Beckenham Crematorium, conducted by Reverend Alison Newman.

Anne was born and educated in Warrington, and went on to become a book keeper. Anne had a ready laugh and lively wit, and she was very proud of her Northern roots. Coming to live in Shortlands, Anne worked for many years as a Secretary for Albert Lake, and for a time she kept the accounts for the Abbeyfield home in Beckenham. ## St. Christopher's Hospice

St. Christopher's is a hospice which provides expert nursing and medical care for people suffering with cancer and other serious illness, and provides ongoing support for their families and friends. It also provides 24 hour nursing care, so that the very ill patients can, if they wish to, remain in their own homes and amongst their own surroundings.

It is a place where everyone is welcome, where the staff are dedicated to the patient's needs and,

most importantly, to listening when they need to talk. St. Christopher's was also a pioneer in pain control and palliative care. Some 1,500 people are treated and cared for each year, but the hospice receives only 40% of the necessary funding from the National Health Service, so there is a real and constant need for financial support to enable them to continue their vital and caring work.
