Jesus recognized in them that "hidden treasure", those qualities that made them the right people to spread the Good News of Jesus.

Over this summer maybe we can do something to connect with our inner talents or resources. It could be playing music, reading, going for walks, talking to neighbours – anything that stimulates our creative thoughts. This can be things we do at home or on holiday.

Then we can offer, with renewed commitment, those talents and resources to continue the work that we have been called to do (or to do something new), wherever that may be and with the people we meet.

I hope that over the summer there will be times when we can uncover some of that "hidden treasure".

## Remembering

### Kathleen Friskney

Kathleen was born in Northampton, and after leaving school she worked at the National Provincial Bank and married Norman, who was a young Army Officer. On his return from active service in Italy they lived at first in Oxford during his postgraduate days at the University. Then with a growing family they moved to Bedford.

In 1958 they moved to Shortlands when Norman was appointed head of Wilson's Grammar School. Kathleen made a great contribution as the wife of a headmaster and played a full part in the varied social and extramural life of the school.

She was an active member of the church and Mother's Union, and was Chairman of the Friends of Kingswood House, spending many years as a hands-on voluntary helper. She lived, in all, a full life of service.

Kathleen was held in the deepest affection by all who knew her. Generous and self-effacing, she lived her faith in her quiet way and by doing so proclaimed aloud her great love for Jesus. In her interests and attitude to life Kathleen's faith shone out as an example of true Christian charity.

### A Night at the Musicals

A year ago Highfield Infants' and Junior Schools decided they wanted to bring music alive and for the children to have opportunities to perform. Since then the choirs in both schools have continued to grow in size, confidence and capacity. In addition to two strong school choirs there is now a chamber choir in each school as well as an adult community choir. Around 175 children and adults sing weekly in a choir and music can be heard resonating throughout both schools.

On 6th June the Infant Choir and the Highfield Junior Voices held a concert in the concert hall at Langley Park School for Boys. I am sure many were amazed at the high standard of both the singing and production - this was no basic school production!

The children set the standard for the rest of the concert with stunning performances of songs from the musicals. The adults were the most nervous, knowing that they needed to match the very high standard set by the children. Whilst rehearsing and performing, the children showed commitment, team work and real drive to achieve their best, with many children really growing in confidence.

The adult choir has brought the community together and has made many of us realise quite how hard it is to learn a new skill. The members of the adult choir have worked hard, had fun, and made friends in addition to producing a great sound.

A huge amount of work has gone on behind the scenes to produce an event such as this with many parents and members of the community giving up their time and skills to ensure a professional production. I am immensely proud to be part of something that is very special. Music is certainly alive and well in the Highfield community!

### Ponds in Shortlands

Did you know that there used to be more than one millpond in the area? You probably know the one on Glassmill Lane – but there was once one to the left of the footpath that runs between Durham Road and Queen Anne Avenue. If it existed today, it would cover part of the garden of three or four houses in each of those roads plus the land in between.

The pond was quite large, and could better have been called a lake. It was surrounded by alder and willow trees, and local boys would swim in it. The picturesque views of its surroundings attracted artists and photographers.

In 1931 approval was given to extend Durham Road and Queen Anne Avenue and so the pond was filled in and the trees cut down. The spring which fed the pond was piped to the River Ravensbourne.

Copies of a 1894 map of Shortlands can be purchased from Bromley library. The map shows other points of interest such as the ponds off South Hill Road and Kingswood Avenue: these are still there, called Kingswood Glen and are looked after by a local group. There were also gravelpits in the Winchester Park area.

Pictures of the millpond will be displayed in the church porch until the end of September.

### Burrswood Hospital

Set in the heart of the Kent countryside near Tunbridge Wells stands this beautiful house and grounds. It was purchased after the war but as it had been requisitioned by the military it was in a dreadful condition. It was carefully restored, making Burrswood into the unique place it is today – a 40-bed hospital.

It was first registered as a nursing home where orthodox medical care was combined with Christian prayers to create a place of healing for the whole person. It includes a beautiful church at the end of the building which was constructed, completed and dedicated in May 1960, with regular services being held for inpatients, staff and visitors.

Following on from a total hip replacement operation I was lucky enough to spend a week there receiving what they call step-down or post operative care where patients receive a period of further care to enable them to achieve optimal recover. I received daily physiotherapy and hydrotherapy which really speeded up my recovery.

All the staff are supportive and encouraging, making recovery quicker and happier, I thoroughly enjoyed my time there and even just a walk around the grounds is very rewarding.
