

Out of the comfort zone

Our thoughts may be beginning to turn to Lent and Easter; we have seen Easter eggs in the shops since the Christmas decorations came down. The church marks Lent as a time of reflection and repentance.

Easter is what is known as a 'moveable feast' and as it falls late this year, the season of Lent is also late. I'm sure many of us will eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday (4th March), before Lent begins on Ash Wednesday on 5th March.

Lent is a time that is traditionally used for prayer, repentance, giving to the poor and self-denial in the period leading up to Easter. Many churches don't have flowers in them at this time.

During Lent, many people commit to fasting or giving up certain types of luxuries as a way of showing their repentance. Often members of churches add in extra times of study to their existing pattern at this time.

Lent lasts for forty days (not including Sundays) and could be described as a way of moving out of our comfort zone. This links with the ministry of Jesus: his journey was not one of comfort but of doing God's mission.

God's Church, the church to which we belong, is called to be part of this Mission. To love with that same costly love that was seen in Jesus.

God calls us to come out of our comfort zone, to find out what He wants of us and to journey with Jesus. We may find this costly and uncomfortable, as Jesus did. In the end, we are called to bring the knowledge of God to those who do not know him, and that may take us to unfamiliar places.

Remembering

Peggy Lyle

We were sorry to hear of the death in Worthing of Peggy Lyle, just two months before her 99th birthday.

Peggy had lived in Beckenham all her married life, moving to South Hill Road with her husband Gordon in the late 1980s when he retired.

Born in Cheshire, she first became involved with youth work at her boarding school in North Wales: it was through that youth work that she met Gordon. They married in 1940, living at first over his dentist's surgery close to Beckenham station. Peggy assisted Gordon in his surgery and together they were part of the Beckenham Red Cross during World War II.

Peggy and Gordon adopted Mary as a baby, and nine months later Peggy gave birth to Jane.

Peggy and Gordon were both deeply involved all their lives with the Beckenham Blind Club and 'Club Land' – a Methodist Youth Club in Camberwell. They were also deeply committed to the Rotary Club of Beckenham.

Soon after Gordon's death in 1999, Peggy moved to Blenheim Court where she stayed until she moved to be nearer her daughter a few years ago.

Peggy was a much-loved friend to many people, and a faithful member of St Mary's Shortlands for many years.

Mission of the month



Bromley Mencap

Bromley Mencap is a small local charity, formed over 60 years ago by a small group of parents who came together for mutual support and to campaign for services for their disabled children.

There are now around 1,700 members and the charity provides a wide range of services and activities for disabled people of all ages with their families and carers.

Bromley Mencap provides a telephone advice service, childcare facilities, respite and short breaks, leisure and school holiday activities, help for elderly carers, employment training and support and help in finding and sustaining jobs. In response to rising needs, support has been increased for older carers and also carers who themselves have a learning disability.

Although the charity is small, they have recently been recognised by four national award schemes and in 2011 won a Guardian Public Service award.

Bromley Mencap does not receive any financial support from the Mencap national charity, and has to raise over £700,000 this year just to maintain the current service for these vulnerable people. Due to the current financial climate, local government cuts and increasing competition, it is becoming extremely difficult for smaller charities to raise much needed funds.

St Mary's was due to welcome Jane Barnes to talk about Bromley Mencap at the 10.30am service on Sunday 2nd March.

My day job: Rev Richard Finch

From Monday to Friday (and on the occasional Sunday) I work at Forest YMCA, based in Walthamstow. My job title is 'Senior Chaplain and Faith Support Manager' and I head up a small team that consists of another Chaplain, volunteer assistants and part-time staff.

Forest YMCA is a large charitable organisation providing accommodation, support and training for over 300 men and women who were homeless.

There is also youth work, children's pre and after school clubs and community sport and leisure facilities. We have a total of about 150 staff.

My day consists of a varying pattern of activities. The most important is the pastoral support for the residents, staff and visitors. Sometimes just an informal 'I was just passing ...' type of chat will lead to an opportunity to support a person prayerfully in a time of need.

We have a pattern of daily and weekly prayer and we celebrate the major Christian festivals of Christmas and Easter. I also help to form links with various faith communities in the area so that we can provide appropriate faith support as required.

As a manager I have to attend meetings and training courses so that I take my part in the organisation of Forest YMCA.

A very different part of my work is coordinating the links between Forest YMCA and Togo YMCA. We have formed a partnership providing some financial support to their Justice and Rehabilitation Project. This encourages legal support to prisoners, and training and work opportunities for former prisoners. I was able to visit the project in 2012 and since then several staff have visited Togo and two Togolese staff have stayed with us.

Most importantly, from the Chief Executive Officer to the Housekeeping assistant, I am there so that we can have a 'chat' – sometimes to give a person a chance to open their heart.

My job is to say – 'go in the love and peace of Christ'.

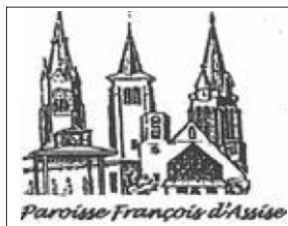

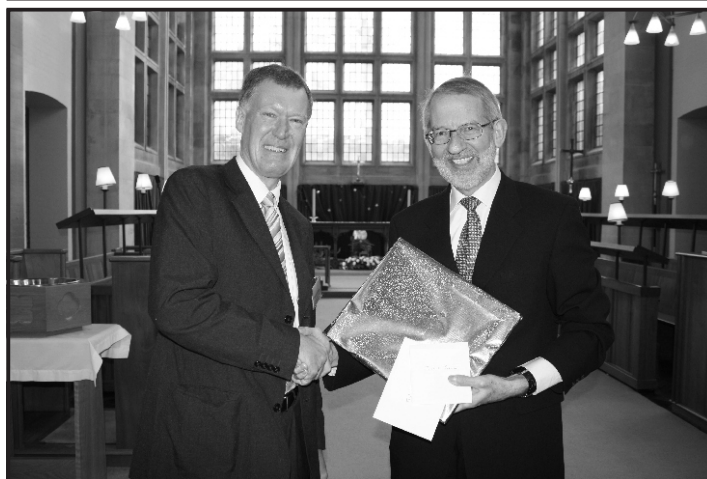
