EE KINGS

Epiphany: curious religious words, which comes into use for a few days after Christmas, and then disappears again. Can you put your finger on what it means?

The date of Epiphany in the Christian calendar is 6th January. It now marks the end of the traditional Christmas period of 12 days, but it wasn't invented by the early Church for the purpose of taking their decorations down!

As a festival, Epiphany (which literally means "the sudden appearance of God") has been around a long time, since AD 350 or thereabouts.

We don't know precisely when Christians started holding a festival in those early times, some people preferred to treat Epiphany as

it's one of those Jesus' birthday, rather than December 25th. Later, though, Christmas became fixed on the day now familiar to us, and Epiphany became associated with the visit of the "Magi" or wise men to Bethlehem instead, at least in the Western part of the Church. Which brings us on to the next question: who were the Magi, and why did they bring gifts to the infant Jesus? Of the 4 Gospel writers, only Matthew makes reference to them. Here are a few facts which may surprise you:

- Despite familiar hymns like "We three Kings of Orient are ..." the Magi are not referred to as kings in the Bible. Matthew describes them as wise men or astrologers.
- Matthew does not state that to commemorate Jesus' birth, but there were 3 Magi. Tradition suggests there were 3 because 3 gifts were offered to Jesus: gold, frankincense

- Matthew refers to the Magi visiting Jesus in Bethlehem, but they go to see him in a house, not a stable. Perhaps by this time Mary and Joseph had found better accommodation, or lost patience with the innkeeper!
- The star which the Magi are said to have followed from the East was probably not a star, but two planets: the main astrological event around the believed time of Jesus' birth was when Jupiter and Saturn were close together in the sky for a time.
- The decision of Herod to slaughter all the Hebrew children in Bethlehem under two years old in an attempt to get rid of Jesus, after interviewing the Magi about him, could suggest that Jesus was no longer a baby by the time they visited him.

So, other than a source of inspiration for hymn writers and Christmas card illustrators, what is the significance of the visit of the Magi to Jesus? In essence, there are perhaps two key points to remember. The first is what the gifts would later symbolise: the gold was for Jesus as King; the frankincense was for Jesus as priest, and the myrrh, as an embalming ointment, was for Jesus as victim on the Cross. The second is that the Magi were not from the lewish community: they came from lands far away from Palestine, and therefore in the Gospel represent the wider world to whom Jesus eventually became known. That is why the Church still celebrates the festival of Epiphany

Founded in 1874, The Leprosy Mission (TLM) is a leading Christian organisation working in around 30 countries across Africa, South Asia, and East Asia, transforming and empowering the lives of people affected by leprosy, a disease that attacks the nervous system.



Whilst research to produce a vaccine to prevent the spread of leprosy continues, an effective and complete cure for the disease - multidrug therapy (MDT) - has been freely available since 1982 but early diagnosis and treatment with MDT is vital to prevent sufferers from consequential injury and disability.

Leprosy is the least contagious communicable disease, is not hereditary and cannot be caught by touch, but fear and stigma can lead to social exclusion which can be more damaging than leprosy's physical symptoms.

TLM continues to work hard in reversing this injustice and its work includes treatment, health care, surgery, physiotherapy, health awareness training and education, and provision of small business loans to enable those affected by leprosy to escape poverty and become independent.


