Over the next six months the strain of caring for their sick mother became increasingly overwhelming for Paul's parents, aunt and uncle. The respite care and the subsequent end-of-life care offered by a Sue Ryder hospice gave invaluable support and ultimately enabled the family to spend precious final days with Eileen in a peaceful and dignified environment. Paul is raising money for Sue Ryder to thank them for the work they do every single day across the country.


