

A Service of Thanksgiving was held at Beckenham Crematorium. Reverend lane Peters conducted the service, which was attended by a small gathering who came to make their farewells.

John was born in Greenwich, He was educated at Gordon Brock Primary School and Aske's Hatcham Boys' Grammar School. On leaving school, he worked for a short time at the Duckham's Oil Company in the laboratory before joining the Metropolitan Police where he served for 33 years. In the early days he won a police commendation for bravery.

When he retired from the Police he went to work for the London Borough of Bromley and became the Mayor's attendant and chauffeur. In the post he loved the opportunity to meet people and the tradition that went with the post.

John was a regular attender at St. Mary's and took a full part in the Widows and Widowers Group.

His two great passions were his classic cars, on which he spent hours of his time, and his holiday apartment in Cavtat, near Dubrovnik, in Croatia.

A Service of Thanksgiving for his life was held at St. Mary's, Shortlands, preceded by a private committal at Beckenham Crematorium. The service was conducted by Canon Paul Miller.

A Very Big Thank You!



I want to thank so many people for their generosity to our Heating Appeal. The breakdown of the boiler during the coldest part of the year was an immense problem and caused so much disruption.

I want to pay tribute to everyone who coped so ably and to all those users of our facilities who had their own programmes disrupted. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Around 200 people have so far contributed to our Appeal. The target is £50,000 and so far we have raised £32,000 - so only £18,000 to go!. We not only needed to replace the boiler but also we discovered asbestos which needed to be removed and were made aware that the heaters in Church, which are over 55 years old, all need replacing.

Many individuals have generously contributed as well as organisations that use and support the Hall. In this connection I would particularly like to acknowledge gifts from the Shortlands Residents' Association and the Friends of St. Mary's.

We are over well half way to achieving our target. There are a number of fundraising opportunities that will be organised over the coming months which will not only boost the Appeal but also be fun. Mission of the Month Christian Aid

Thank you for all you do to make Christian Aid Week such a great success here at St. Mary's. This year it takes place from 13-19 May 2012. The aim of the Christian Aid Organisation is one where everyone can live a full life free from poverty. Christian Aid works to eradicate continuing poverty, striving to achieve equality, dignity and freedom for all regardless of faith or nationality. They provide urgent practical and effective help where needed in tackling the effect of poverty as well as the root cause.

One of the many schemes that Christian Aid is involved in this year is to help fund the work that Malaria Control Agents are involved in for a year. They are helping to save the life in a continent where according to the World Health Organisation a child dies from malaria every 45 seconds. All the malaria control agents are local volunteers. After receiving training and equipment they will provide communities with advice, use of mosquito nets, spot symptoms of malaria and access treatment. This is vital work; in Sierra Leone one child in three will be able to sleep under a net, and malaria causes the death of about third of all child deaths in the under 5's. This is a scheme that is locally based and effective, the benefits are immediate and life changing yet very simple.
