In commenting on the award Canon Paul Miller, Vicar of Shortlands, said 'Gill thoroughly derserves this award for outstanding service to the community and for her work in Guiding. I know she was thrilled to be honoured in this way and I am sure the whole community joins with me in offering her our warmest congratulations'.

Gills' first experience of Guiding was when she joined Brownies as a 7-year old in 1957. Apparently she wasn't the best-behaved in the pack, as she remembers having to sit next to Brown Owl when she went to church so she could keep her eye on her! When Gill became a Guide her favourite activity was camping, which hasn't changed to this day - running camps and outdoor activities is for her one of the best parts of being a leader. 'A lot of Guide units these days do not get the chance to have a week-long Summer Camp, so Shortlands Guides are very lucky, and we have a

'I first took over 2nd Shortlands Guides when my younger daughter, Gemma, was a baby, and she has now been a leader herself for several years. A rota of Guide mums volunteered to look after my 3 young children in exchange for me running the Guides for their teenagers. Our first camp in 1983 was quite hard work, with 3 children under 6 and 25 Guides there seemed to be as much baby equipment as Guide camping kit!

Things have changed a lot over the years - my Leader's uniform back in the 1980s was a tailored suit and smart shoes. Today's joggers, rugby shirt and trainers are much more practical and make it easier to join in with activities! Guide uniforms too have changed, with the "uniform" appearance giving way to a range of mix-and-match options.

But at the heart of Guiding is still teamwork, a good patrol system, with the older experienced Guides helping the younger ones and showing them the way.

I have to admit that I do spend a vast amount of time on Guiding, but I do get a lot out of it too. Seeing the girls have a great time at camp,



Christopher Yapp, the son of Susie and Stephen Evans of Kingswood Road, has recently been commissioned as an officer in the Queen's Royal Lancers and is preparing to be deployed to Afghanistan.

Chris first put on a uniform at the tender age of four, when he joined Highfield Junior School shortly after then he donned the grey and green of St. Mary's Seventh Mowgli Cub pack, and after that the colours of Ardingly College in Sussex where he was, in due course, made Head Boy.

Following his degree and travel to the Far East, South Africa, Alaska and New Zealand. Chris took up the greatest challenge of his life to date; the Regular Officer Commissioning Course at The Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. On Friday, 13th April this year he completed his year's training and Commissioned as an Officer in the Queen's Royal Lancers, his chosen Regiment, whose role is to act as Armoured Reconnaissance in advance of the rest of the Army.

The Queen's Royal Lancers are based at Catterick in Yorkshire, but Chris will be spending the majority of the summer in Dorset, where he is carrying out his specialist training. and acquiring the skills needed to lead a troop of 4 vehicles and 12

Of his time at Sandhurst, Chris says: "The course pushed me to levels of pressure, concentration, exhaustion and determination I had never previously experienced. We were quite literally broken down,

Mission of the Month - August The Leprosy Mission

Founded in 1874, The Leprosy Mission (TLM) is a leading Christian organisation working in around 30 countries across Africa, South Asia, and East Asia, transforming and empowering the lives of people affected by leprosy, a disease that attacks the nervous system.

Whilst research to produce a vaccine to prevent the spread of leprosy continues, an effective and complete cure for the disease multidrug therapy (MDT) - has been freely available since 1982 but early diagnosis and treatment with MDT is vital to prevent sufferers from consequential injury and disability.

Leprosy is the least contagious communicable disease and is not hereditary and cannot be caught by touch, but fear and stigma can lead to social exclusion which can be more damaging than leprosy's physical symptoms. TLM continues to work hard in reversing this injustice and its work includes treatment, health care, surgery, physiotherapy, health awareness training and education, and provision of small business loans to enable those affected by leprosy to

escape poverty and become

independent.

Mission of the Month - September Demelza Hospice Care for Children

supports almost 800 life-limited children and their families. Across Kent. South East London and East Sussex. Demelza has two hospices, one in Eltham, Greenwich, and one in Sittingbourne, Kent, as well as a community nursing team based in East Sussex.

Demelza House, Sittingbourne, was opened in 1998 and last year an Appeal was launched, 'Bricks and Mortar' to raise money to bring the bedrooms up to the state of the art rooms at the Eltham Hospice. The children's bedrooms have been modernised and a bathroom built between two bedrooms giving eight bedrooms and four bathrooms. In addition two teenage bedrooms have been built away from the other rooms, with en-suite facilities and also an Hydrotherapy Pool. This will be of great use to our children with muscular conditions and can

Demelza Hospice Care for Children has to raise £8 million per annum and we receive virtually no Government funding.
