

Bishop James to visit Shortlands



The Bishop of Rochester, The Rt Rev James Langstaff, is to make his first formal visit to the Parish of Shortlands on Sunday, 11 September.

He will preside at the 10.30am morning service, the occasion of St. Mary's Patronal Festival.

It will also be the occasion of the Church's Gift Day.

Bishop James, who became the 107th Bishop of Rochester in December 2010, has been to Shortlands on an informal visit to meet the clergy of the Beckenham Deanery in January, but this will be his first visit to the Parish.

Prior to coming to Rochester, Bishop James was the Bishop of Lynn in the Diocese of Norwich.

Canon Paul Miller, Vicar of Shortlands, and the Bishop actually served as curates in the same Parish of Farnborough in Hampshire. Canon Paul was there in the late 1970s and Bishop James in the early 1980s. They are also representing the Diocese in the 4-man Rochester clergy golf team at the National Diocesan Golf Day in July at Frilford Heath.

The PCC earlier this year agreed a 5 year Strategic Plan to develop the ministry and mission of St. Mary's within Shortlands.

There are a number of projects within the plan which are still being formulated and the current intention of this year's Gift Day is, subject to some final technical checks, to enhance and improve the sound system in the church.

The reason we need to do this is due to the expanding congregation which means the whole building is often full! 419 packed into the church on the Festival of Pentecost for the Scout Centenary service.

John Rees

John Morris Rees was born in Sheffield where his father was working as a Factory Inspector for the Civil Service. His parents both came from South Wales with Welsh as their first language. John was born in 1921, his sister Dilys in 1923.

Education was highly valued in his family. He went to Jesus College, Oxford, reading first Maths then, after a spell in the RAF, returned to do Physics instead. He spent his wartime service in Egypt and Turkey working with radar. After Oxford he too became a Civil Service Factory Inspector, a job he did, with various promotions along the way, until he retired in 1981.

He married his first wife, Jeanne, a friend of his sister, in 1948. They settled in London and in 1952 a son, David was born followed by Catherine in 1954. After posting to Birmingham the family moved to Bromley in 1961 and stayed there. Sadly, soon after his retirement Jeanne was diagnosed with breast cancer and she died in 1982 aged only 59.

He later married Kathleen and they began to forge a new life together in which golf played a significant role, even living within the sight of the golf course.

Catherine, meanwhile had married and gave him two grandchildren, Eilise and Owain. He later became a great-grandfather to three boys, Lian, Raif and Logan.

A Service of Thanksgiving, conducted by Canon Paul Miller, took place at Beckenham Crematorium at which friends from university and the golf club supported his wife Kathleen and other members of the family.

Edna was born in 1927 in Willesden and grew up in Kenton, near Harrow. She attended Priestmead Primary School, where she first met her

On 17 May Claire Tillotson was installed by the Bishop as an Honorary Lay Canon at Rochester Cathedral.

A large contingent from Shortlands joined Claire and her family, some of whom had travelled from Wales, for this significant occasion.

The choir sang Evensong at which the lessons were read by the Dean and Claire. Claire was then presented to the Bishop by Canon Paul who explained Claire had been appointed as Lay Canon in recognition of her music therapy work in Bethlehem. Claire was installed by the Dean into her stall named after William of Perth.

William of Perth was a Scottish baker who, in 1021, set out from Perth on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. During his journey he spent a night at the priory of St Andrew of Rochester. He was murdered shortly after he left the monastery on the way through Rainham, and his body was brought back and buried in the Cathedral. Numerous miracles were reported to have occurred at his tomb, which became a place of pilgrimage. The present Quire was built, under the leadership of the Sacrist, William of Hoo, from the offerings made at his tomb. Sadly, nothing is left of his burial place, but there is a stained glass window commemorating him in the north wall of the north quire transept. The Stall named after him can be found on the south side of the Quire.

The Mission to Seafarers is a Christian charity and works in more than 230 ports around the world caring for the practical and spiritual welfare of seafarers of all nationalities and faiths.

The Mission helps the seafarers by visiting them or welcoming them to their centres, helping them stay in contact with their families by phone or email after spending months at sea, helping an abandoned crew, or helping a crew member in hospital many thousands of miles from home.

Just look in your kitchen cupboards, fridge and freezer - much of what you see will have come by sea. We are all much indebted to these seafarers.

The address at St. Mary's on Sunday, 10 July at the 10.30am service will focus on the work of the Mission to Seafarers.

Mothers' Union - 100 not out!

Mothers' Union [MU] at St Mary's is either 100 years old this year – or it was last year! We know that Mothers' Union was active at St. Mary's by 1911... but we have been unable to find a record of a formal start date.

MU is a Christian organisation, founded in 1878 by Mary Sumner, the wife of a Hampshire clergyman and mother of three. She believed in the importance of family life, and set up a group to help women prepare for motherhood and the physical and spiritual needs of their children. MU has grown to a worldwide organisation of some 4 million members in 80 countries, with its headquarters in London.

Here at St. Mary's we have 34 members. We meet monthly for talks on various subjects, and we have several purely social events every year. As well as our meetings, we collect toiletries for use in womens' refuges; support the MU Literacy & Development Programme in Sudan and other developing countries from our Mission of the Month proceeds; this year we have sent £118 to "Make a Mother's Day"; and more

We will celebrate 100 years of the Mothers' Union at St. Mary's at a special Choral Evensong on Sunday, 17 July at 6.30pm. We hope both former and current members will be present and that Church and community will support this occasion.

The preacher will be Canon Ruth Oates who is Vicar of St. Mary's, Gravesend and also Rural Dean of Gravesend.

There will be drinks served after the service.
