Krakow 2012

Unique opportunity for Shortlands group to visit Poland.

There is much going on in Poland in 2012. The UEFA Euro 2012 football championship will be held there in June. And in October Canon Paul Miller will lead a party from Shortlands to Krakow. 'For some time it has been my plan to lead a group to Poland. It is a wonderful country and Krakow in particular is an amazing place.' Krakow is one of the most beautiful cities in Europe, ranking with Prague and Vienna as one of the architectural gems of our continent. The city gave us Chopin, Copernicus and Pope Jean-Paul II, and was the medieval capital of Poland. With 6,000 monuments, 140 churches and 2.5 million works of art, it is a city with a rich cultural heritage. But Krakow is far from just a collection of buildings, it has an atmosphere that is vibrant, alive, timeless and is the perfect destination for a European short break.

Canon Paul has arranged a visit from 25-28 October 2012 through Riviera Travel. It will be based at the 4 star centrally located Novotel Krakow Centrum Hotel on a bed and breakfast basis. The hotel is situated in the centre of Krakow just 10 minutes from the magnificent Wawel Castle and 150 metres away from the main market square with its many shops, museums and galleries. It has a fitness centre and swimming pool.

The tour will include:

- Return flights from Gatwick to Krakow
- Executive coach for return airport transfers in Krakow
- Three nights at the 4* centrally located Novotel Krakow Centrum Hotel, including breakfast
- A sightseeing tour of the preserved old town of Krakow
- A visit to the Wawel castle district, home of the Royal Palace
- A visit to Auschwitz Birkenau
- Fully escorted throughout by an experienced Riviera Tour Manager

The inclusive cost is only £399. There are single rooms available at a supplement of £100.

This is a specially arranged tour but we have to book early to secure this special price. We will arrange coach travel to and from Gatwick airport at a small extra cost. What NOT to do before you go on holiday

Criminals just love Twitter and Facebook. Now they can locate unattended homes so much more easily - often within seconds of people posting comments about being on holiday on these social networking websites.

Thieves once had it hard — having to wander about neighbourhoods, peering over hedges, bribing milkmen, looking for empty houses. Now it is so much simpler: they stay at home and surf the internet - and can track down your address from a one-line posting within 60 seconds, according to researchers. Thieves look for messages such as 'packing my cases' and 'just landed' with a smiley face, only hours after the sender's location was given as an airport.

How do they do it? A check on the family name and, for instance, the name of their child's school, cross referenced with an online address database, shows the location of the home. The study, by Co-operative Travel, goes on to warn people that their children are the worst offenders, as 51 per cent of young people tell all their friends about the forthcoming holiday....

Talk to your baby

One in five new parents believe that their baby will only benefit from being talked to after it has reached three months old. Five per cent of parents do not even think they need to teach their baby speech. They assume that language skills just sort of 'happen'.

Instead, The National Literacy Trust urges parents to start talking to their babies the moment they are born, and to use every opportunity to teach them words and meanings. "Few moments in life are more magical than the first time you hear your baby talk. It's the start of a lifelong conversation." There are some excellent Bible stories available for young children, with which you can begin to teach not just words, but a meaning in life

Meanwhile, recent tests by scientists in Paris' Descartes University have found that babies can even remember melodies they heard in the womb, after they are born.

The Way I See It

This summer the Duke of Edinburgh reached his ninetieth birthday. Those of us who can remember the tall, fair-headed naval officer who married Princess Elizabeth in 1947 have become used to his figure walking just behind the Queen on royal occasions over the last 64 years, often raising a laugh as he follows her along a line of well-wishers with a few well-chosen (or occasionally not quite so well chosen) remarks. His has been a remarkable life and his continuing energy and individuality as the Prince Consort have been remarkable. It's hard to believe that he is ninety

Yet the truth is, we are becoming increasingly aware that more and more people around us are reaching that once rare milestone. I remember being taken as a child to see a great-aunt who had just had her ninetieth birthday. We were ushered into the room to be confronted with a frail figure, mouth open, pale eyes almost invisible - a kind of living wax-work. Today among our friends, neighbours and fellow church members there will probably be many ninety year olds - and even centurions- who are far from being wax-works. People may not yet match Methuselah in the Bible, who (it is claimed) reached 969 years, but we are on average living longer, and that prolonged life more often retains a degree of good health and activity.

Yet we live in a world which worships youth! The reason the Bible lists all those legendary men of old in Genesis (chapter 5) is that old age was seen as the mark of wisdom, something to be valued and revered. The leaders of Israel, and the leaders of the early churches, were called 'elders', because it was inconceivable that younger men could do it. None of that 'too old at fifty' in those days!

It's an observable fact that congregations in our churches are, on the whole, well above the national average age. That probably doesn't matter too much, so long as they are constantly fed with the rising age-groups. As one shrewd observer commented to me, 'It's quite natural to mug up for finals!' St Paul told Timothy not to let the people among whom he ministered 'despise his youth' (he was well over thirty at the time). We now need the balancing advice. Let no one despise the elderly! We're not just hanging around. Like Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, we'll faithfully do our bit until we topple off the perch.

for September - Railway Children

Railway Children reaches out to street children in India, East Africa and the UK. Most street children are unable to adequately provide basic human needs for themselves: food, shelter and protection from harm. The first priority of Railway Children is to help these most vulnerable children. Their outreach workers identify children and young people alone and at risk of harm and engage with them on the streets, on their own territory.

Children living alone on the streets in any society face exploitation from people who view them as commodities to trade, use and abuse. In areas of extreme poverty this problem is increased since the opportunity to use, sell and abuse children is both available and rarely punished. Railway Children works to increase awareness in communities and help people see that they are children in need of care and protection, not commodities.

Last year Railway Children helped 25,076 street children around the world. Concurrently Railway Children aspires to create a safer, brighter future for these children and believes that to achieve this they must effect the sustained change that can only come about by educating communities and lobbying governments.
