

What does Remembrance Sunday mean to me?

I heard a huge explosion just after 11pm that night, 6 December 1982. It was obviously a bomb. As Major Bob Stewart and the Duty Field Officer of my Battalion, the Cheshires, I immediately rang the Guardroom to find out what had happened. The Guard Commander, a Corporal, said that he thought it was in the 'Shoppin Well Centre', where there was a discotheque which our soldiers used. I jumped in my car and was there in two minutes. The discotheque had been blown apart.

With a torch I went into the dark wrecked building. The first person I came across was one of my soldiers, Private Mark Young who was just 18 years old. He was lying against a bit of wrecked fence in great pain. I knelt down to see what I could do. There wasn't much. I thought he would live and said so to him but he has never walked again.

Further into the gloom I found mangled dead bodies and many other people grievously hurt but surprisingly little noise or screaming. I spoke to and cuddled a girl in my arms as she died. We talked for the two minutes that took. She was incredibly brave and knew she was dying; I believe in a state of grace. It was overwhelming

and utterly awful. She was 18 too. I could do little and wept until I gripped myself. We needed massive help and I had to get to it.

For the next seven hours I became the Incident Commander and tried to coordinate firemen, medics, lifting gear and even the media. Our Padre, John Hooley, moved amongst the debris praying over remains and comforting the wounded as they waited to die or be rescued. Nothing had ever prepared him for what he had to deal with that night. Later I recommended him to be Mentioned in Despatches which he thoroughly deserved and received.

I had been playing squash with my clerk, Lance Corporal Clinton Collins, until I had dropped him off at his house at 8.30pm earlier in the evening. I found him trapped under mangled concrete in the discotheque. His wife Tina was lying beside him. I spoke to her. She was amazingly calm but told me 'Clinton isn't moving'. At 6.30am the next morning, after we had recovered all the living, I sat beside Tina's bed in Altnagelvin Hospital, Londonderry and told her what she already knew. Clinton never moved again.

After that it took me about five hours, to formally identify my soldiers' bodies in the hospital morgue. What a ghastly duty that was. Clinton Collins was the most difficult. He wasn't physically damaged as far as I could tell but he

looked nothing like the young energetic man who had beaten me at squash the night before.

Seventeen people, eleven of them soldiers and six civilians died that night. All were youngsters. Three of the civilians were girls including the lovely lady who had died in my arms. Six of the dead soldiers were mine and the other five soldiers were from my Battalion or attached to it. Over thirty out of the 120 soldiers in A Company that I commanded were injured too.

A few days later I sat beside the coffins as they flew back to England in a Hercules aircraft. Then I attended six funerals in Cheshire. Five of the six sets of parents put their arms round me at the graveside. What incredible people they were. I felt humbled and guilty. After all I was the officer who was responsible for

their sons. I had failed in that respect. I still feel that way twenty nine years later.

A few days before Christmas 1982, as I came out of St. George's Church in Stockport after my sixth and last funeral I saw an old lady crying on the pavement opposite. I crossed over and tried to comfort her by saying that my soldier was now beyond all pain and safe. She said I didn't understand why she was crying. I remember exactly what she told me. "When I was a very little girl in 1915 I stood here and watched 800 young men of the Cheshires go into that church. They went off to the Somme and when they came back they filled three pews. That's why I'm crying. I'm remembering them as well."

That's what Remembrance Sunday means to me too.

Mission of the Month

St. Christopher's Hospice

St Christopher's Hospice:

exists to promote and provide skilled and compassionate palliative care of the highest quality, was founded by Dame Cicely Saunders in 1967 St Christopher's Hospice was the first modern hospice.

St Christopher's Hospice offers:

- 48 beds on four wards providing in-patient medical and nursing care led by consultants in palliative medicine and experienced and specially qualified nurses
- Home Care led by clinical nurse specialists in teams focused on each of the five local authorities and primary care trust areas – Bromley, Croydon, Lambeth, Lewisham and Southwark
- The Anniversary Centre which was opened last year offers a 'social hub' for patients and families, and includes a café with internet access, a rehabilitation gym, treatment rooms, a bathing suite, group rooms and a hairdressing salon. They offer a programme of social events which is also open to the general public
- Extensive planned day care and a range of supportive care services, including creative and complementary therapies and delivered in a variety of settings
- Inpatient and home care multi-professional teams that include social workers, chaplain and spiritual care lead, welfare advisers, psychiatrists, physiotherapists, occupational therapist, complementary and creative therapists, bereavement service volunteers and others
- St Christopher's Candle Project is a specialist service for all bereaved children and their families. It offers individual and group support, a national telephone advice line, consultancy and training
- Major programmes of education and research

On any one day, St Christopher's at home service cares for around 600 people in their own homes 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

St Christopher's Candle Project works with more than 250 bereaved children and their families each year.

St Christopher's cares for over 2000 adults each year. Each year they provide over 15,000 days of care on their wards and support around 2,000 people in their own homes.

It costs over £14 million to deliver all the services. Only about a third of this comes from the NHS. This means that they need to raise more than £9 million from supporters and the local community.

Beckenham and Rochester vote in favour of women bishops

The clergy and laity of the Beckenham Deanery Synod at its latest meeting voted in favour of the proposed legislation whereby women may be ordained as Bishops.

The legislation has been passed down by the General Synod, the Church's parliament, to all 44 Diocesan Synods to express their views, and in turn the Rochester Diocesan Synod passed it down to the 17 Deanery Synods, of which Beckenham is one.

Canon Paul Miller, the Area Dean of Beckenham, reported that the debate had been well attended. They heard the Theological Advisor to the Archbishop's Council, Dr. Martin Davie, clearly explain the 'for' and 'against' of the proposed legislation and thereafter a debate followed. The voting was in houses, the House of Clergy voted 6 'for' and 4 'against', the House of Laity voted 20 'for', 9 'against' with 2 'abstentions'.

The voting of the Deanery Synod was taken note of at the Rochester Diocesan Synod debate which was held in mid October at Trinity School, Belvedere. It was announced there that 15 of the 17 Deanery Synods had approved the legislation, with 2 Synods voting not as prescribed and therefore were not included.

And the result of the Diocesan Synod debate was:

House of Bishops:	'for' 2	'against' 0	'abstentions' 0
House of Clergy:	36	12	0
House of Laity:	34	11	2

The General Synod will debate and vote in February 2012.
