Two Shortlands children show the Easter eggs they found after over 100 children and young people took part in the annual Easter egg hunt after the main Easter Day Service.

'The Easter services were very well attended and the Church looked magnificent,' enthused Canon Paul Miller. 'We have seen steadily more people joining St. Mary's and the community very much values a Christian presence here in Shortlands. Over 500 people attended our Mothering Sunday service in March. We are finding more and more that people are wanting a spiritual dimension to their lives. Families and young people in particular are finding a welcome here and they want to belong.

'I also feel that many want a good Anglican service. There is so much variety now that sometimes people are never sure what they are going to get when they go to Church. Here in Shortlands we offer a traditional Church of England service with excellent music and a down to earth approach to preaching. We try and involve as many people as possible but also provide an environment for people who just want "to be". We are inclusive and welcome everyone. Through our outreach to families we host a large number of baptisms and are involved in caring for many people who have been bereaved.'

It may be said that Phyl had a strong character. Anyone who tried to persuade her to see a doctor or go to hospital would tell you that. For all that she was tiny by the time she died, she had the stubbornness for a woman many tines her size! She did not want to go near a hospital – even if she could hardly breathe - and she had no truck with doctors.

Her creativity showed particularly at Christmas when she would make decorations and baskets of flowers. Her flat was highly colourful at that season.

She was proudest of her family: she adored her grandchildren and great grandchildren - there were always little treats for them.

On being asked her greatest achievement, Haitch remarked wryly: 'living to 84 given the number of cigarettes she smoked!' She was never without that handbag, her fags and lighter! Phyl needed her strength of character. Her life was not easy. She survived TB as a younger woman.

Phyl will be greatly missed - she was one of a kind.

Dorothy Rankin

Dorothy was born and brought up in Hull, and had two sisters and a brother. Sadly she lost her father at the age of only 2 to gas poisoning.

She left school at the age of 14 and began a hairdressing apprenticeship before joining the RAF in 1939. During the war that she met Ron at a dance. Their courtship was carried out during black outs and bombings and within six months they decided to get married. One of the girls in the fabric shop where Dorothy worked as a parachute packer made her wedding dress. The cake was real but the icing was on cardboard, hired from a shop and had to be returned.

headed for London, initially living with Ron's parents in Kingswood Road with their son Tony. When Tony later married Jan and had two daughters, Joanna and Nicole, Dorothy became not only a very proud grandmother but considered them the two daughters she never

Dorothy was a very independent woman - probably in part because of Ron's unsocial hours in Smithfield market - and so she had various hobbies. At the age of 55 she learned to swim! The couple had a good social life at the Foxgrove Club, she belonged to the Ladies' darts team, played bingo and continued her love of dancing. She also took up

pottery and upholstery and loved boot sales. Dorothy continuing hairdressing until well into her 80s.

Sadly her last few years were marred by dementia. but there was still something of the old Dorothy there, the lovely personality and generous heart.

Dorothy was a life long believer and her funeral reflected this. A Service of Thanksgiving, prior to Cremation, conducted by Reverend Jane Peters took place at Beckenham Crematorium where a large gathering of family and friends – some from her childhood - met to say farewell to her and to pay tribute to a wonderful wife, mother, grandmother, motherin-law and friend.


The day will conclude with an Ascension Day service at 8.00pm to which all are welcome. The service will be followed by drinks and the Bishop will light the Ascension Day rocket!

Treasures of Lambeth Palace Library 400th Anniversary Exhibition 1610-2010

To celebrate 400 years since its foundation, Lambeth Palace Library is set to open its doors with a fascinating exhibition,

On show will be key items collected during Lambeth Palace Library's four hundred years as a working library. Treasures include a Gutenberg Bible (Mainz, 1455), the first book printed in Western Europe from movable metal type; the 12th century Lambeth Bible, regarded as one of the monuments of Romanesque art; and King Richard III's 15th century manuscript Book of Hours, which was in his tent at the Battle of Bosworth in August 1485.

'Treasures of Lambeth Palace Library - 400th Anniversary Exhibition 1610-2010' runs from Monday, 17 May to Friday, 23 July 2010. It will be held in The Great Hall, Lambeth Palace Library, Lambeth Palace Road, London SE1 7JU. 
