London Borough of Bromley to the rescue!

The Early Years Capital Funding Panel of the London Borough of Bromley have come to the rescue of St. Mary's Pre-School. They have awarded further support to their initial grant to create an improved outdoor play area after it was discovered the Hall floor's foundation had sunk.

The Department of Children Schools and Families allocated the London Borough of Bromley over £4 million in capital grants to support standards and access in early years settings. From this grant St. Mary's Pre-School was one of over one hundred settings to receive support to improve its facilities and it was agreed that the outdoor play area on the existing patio would be an appropriate facility to improve and develop.

'We were delighted to receive the grant,' reported Canon Paul Miller,

'but when work started we discovered a large hole not only in the existing patio but one that stretched under the Hall floor. Over the years there has been considerable movement and this has created the problem.'

After consultation with the Borough surveyor and the engineers and surveyors employed by St. Mary's it was decided to create a scheme to fill the void.

'The Early Years and Children's Access service have been brilliant and so helpful. I cannot speak highly enough of their support and advice. Councillor Noad, one of the Shortlands Councillors and Children and Young People Portfolio Holder, has also taken a keen interest.'

'The major works are set to begin in August and will be completed as soon as possible. One of the



challenges we face is that the builders, Calmore Construction, who will be supporting the main contractor Uretek, the floor stabilisation specialists, commence constructing our new toilet and washroom facility in Church House

in early July and will be involved in both schemes at the same time,' continued Canon Paul Miller.

The engineers are GDC Partnership Ltd of Bromley and the surveyor Martin Verrell.

Celebration of Christenings

This month on Sunday, 18 July at 10.30am St. Mary's is holding a Celebration of Christenings Service. We have sent invitations out to all the families who have brought children for baptism during the last 10 years. But everyone is welcome and the regular congregation will have an opportunity to celebrate their baptism as well, wherever that happened to be.

Everyone present at the service will be offered a small wooden cross which was made in Jerusalem. It will remind each person of the sign of the cross that was made on their foreheads when they came for baptism.

The service will focus on the four main symbols that a christening service embraces. Firstly the cross, secondly the Christian name or names given at baptism, thirdly the water in which we are baptised and finally the candle given to the baptised.

'We hope many will come that have been invited and that together we can celebrate and affirm our Christian beginnings. I have never organised a service like this before and am looking forward to the opportunity' said Canon Paul Miller.

Anyone is welcome to come and there will be drinks afterwards.

Sharon was born in Londonderry but moved as a child with her family to Scotland. She was one of four and is survived by her parents, William and Marion, her brothers, Anthony and James and her sister Denise.

At a young age she decided to follow a career in nursing. She was a ward sister by the time she was 24. Her last post was at the Priory Hospital in Hayes where she found great fulfilment as a psychiatric nurse.

She married Andrew in 1993 and they had one daughter, Katrina.

She was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and spent a long time in care at St. Cecilia's before her death in March.

Sharon was buried in Scotland, but a Thanksgiving Service was held at St. Mary's, Shortlands, conducted by Canon Paul Miller, at which family, neighbours and friends gathered to support Andrew and Katrina.

Julia Marriott

Julia (or Julie as she was known) was born in Beckenham. She was one of

four and is survived by her brothers, Stephen and Paul, and her sister, Mary. She attended Valley Primary School and Cator Park Girls School before beginning a career in banking firstly at Barclays and then at the Qatar National Bank in Mayfair where she became Information Systems Manager. It was here in 1989 she also met her partner Chris.

Julie loved classical music, visiting National Trust and English Heritage sites as well as holidays and playing bridge.

A Service of Thanksgiving, conducted by Canon Paul Miller, took place at Beckenham Crematorium prior to cremation at which a large congregation of family and friends paid tribute to a much loved and respected person.

Barbara was born in Newcastle upon Tyne. She spent her early years in Paris. At the age of 15 she returned to England and to boarding school in Durham.

Parenting Course in Shortlands

We are delighted to announce that a Parenting Course is to be offered in Shortlands in September.

Julianne Medway, a trained facilitator for the Triple P - Positive Parenting Program Course, is to lead two courses in Shortlands during 2010/2011. One will be for parents of teenage children and the other for parents of under 11s.

'I am excited by this opportunity,' enthused Julianne. 'The course equips parents from every walk of life with skills that can directly and positively affect their children's welfare.'

Triple P is an eight week course. It is a support strategy aimed at the prevention of behavioural, emotional and developmental problems in children. This is achieved by enhancing the



knowledge, skills and confidence of parents. It helps to improve parenting skills and assists parents in building positive relationships with their children.

The first course in Shortlands will commence on Tuesday, 28 September at 8.00pm and will run for 8 weeks. It will be for parents of under 11s. The course for parents of teenage children will commence in January 2011.

Holiday in Moldova?

Well, not quite... 'Telecommunications Eastern European Challenge' (TEECH) is a registered charity established in 1999 to provide practical and material aid to the people of Eastern Europe. Each summer we take a coach load of volunteers and an articulated lorry packed with aid to work on a project in Romania or Moldova; the project planned for 2010 is based on an orphanage at Falesti in Moldova. We have already provided cash for urgent repair work on the heating system at the orphanage but much remains to be done. Individuals with plumbing or electrical skills are particularly welcome but there is plenty to do for the DIY enthusiast. The dates for the trip this year are August 14 - 28. If you cannot commit to the trip but would still like to help, we are looking for clean, warm clothing in very good condition for children and adults. Warm bedding is also welcome as the temperature can sink to -20 degrees C in winter. Unfortunately, storage limitations prevent us from handling large volumes of general second-hand clothing.

Why 'Telecommunications ...'? We started back in 1998 as 'BTRL Aid to Romania' based at BT Research Labs, Martlesham Heath, Suffolk. BT has given very significant support over the years and continues to provide a lorry and fuel for the trip.

Mission of the Month

Mercy Ships

Mercy Ships, a global charity, has operated a fleet of hospital ships in developing nations since 1978. Following the example of Jesus, Mercy Ships brings hope and healing to the poor, mobilising people and resources worldwide.

In 1978 a retired ocean liner called Victoria was purchased and work began recruiting crew and raising funds to bring the vessel into compliance with international standards. Over four years Victoria was transformed into a hospital ship, with the addition of 3 operating theatres and a 40 bed ward, carrying a volunteer crew of 350 from all over the world. In 1982, the vessel sailed as the newly christened Anastasis – the first Mercy Ship. Since then, various ships in the Mercy Ships fleet have served in more than 150 ports in developing nations around the world, bringing lasting change to hundreds of thousands of lives.

Imagine a ship crewed by doctors, nurses, water engineers and agriculturalists visiting some of the world's poorest countries. Now imagine their life-changing services offered free of charge... right now dedicated volunteers from around the world are bringing hope and healing to thousands of people who could never have believed it possible. Welcome to Mercy Ships, a compassionate response to a world where many have lost hope.
