New Bishop of Rochester announced



The new Bishop of Rochester will be the Right Reverend James Langstaff, currently the Suffragan Bishop of Lynn in the Diocese of Norwich. In addition, he is now the Bishop designate of Rochester.

Bishop James (53) will become the 107th Bishop of Rochester later this year. He succeeds the Right Reverend Dr Michael Nazir-Ali, who retired in September 2009

Bishop James is looking forward to joining the Diocese, but will not actually take up the role until he is officially installed as Bishop of Rochester at a special service in Rochester Cathedral later this year. He said, "Being appointed Bishop of Rochester is a huge privilege and also a weighty responsibility. I greatly look forward to sharing in the mission and ministry of the Church in the diocese, getting to know the wider communities and their people His pastoral and leadership gifts, and seeing the things of God's Kingdom grow."

Reverend Graham James said, "James Langstaff has been an outstanding Bishop of Lynn. In just six years he has become greatly respected in the Diocese of Norwich and the wider community alike. His people skills are well reflected in both his pastoral care and his extensive engagement with social issues, especially related to housing. He has energy, intelligence and a wonderful lightness of touch in speaking of God and the gospel. We will miss him and Bridget enormously. The Diocese of Rochester will soon discover its good fortune."

The Right Reverend Dr Brian Castle, Bishop of Tonbridge said, "I am delighted that Bishop James is to be the next Bishop of Rochester. He brings with him a rich and varied parish experience and the wisdom and insights to lead the diocese into the future to which God is calling us. I look forward to working with him. Both Bishop James, Bridget and their family can be assured of a warm welcome as they move into the dincese '

The Venerable Clive Mansell. Archdeacon of Tonbridge served on the Crown Nominations Committee that recommended the appointment to the Queen and Prime Minister. alongside five others, lay and clergy, from the Diocese of Rochester. He said, "I am delighted at the appointment of Bishop James.

Bishop James trained for the ordained ministry at St Iohn's College, Nottingham. He served his curacy in the Diocese of Guildford before moving to the Diocese of Birmingham in 1986 as Vicar of Nechells. He served as Chaplain to the Bishop of Birmingham from 1996 - 2000 before being appointed as Rector of Holy Trinity. Sutton Coldfield, also becoming Area Dean of Sutton Coldfield in 2002. While in Birmingham he developed a particular interest in urban regeneration and began a continuing involvement in social housing. He has served as Bishop of Lynn since 2004.

Bishop James is married to Bridget and they have two adult children, Alasdair and Helen. Bridget is a Regional Development Manager with the National Treatments Agency for Substance Misuse, working especially in prisons. Together, Bishop James and Bridget enjoy walking, attending the theatre, reading and travelling. Bishop James is a keen choral singer.

The date of Bishop James' formal installation in Rochester Cathedral has yet to be announced.

Remembering

Grace Waring

Grace was born in 1919 - she was the youngest of seven. She was christened and later married at St. Hilda's Church in Crofton Park and confirmed by the Bishop of Woolwich at Southwark Cathedral.

Grace entered the Civil Service in 1938 and during the war served firstly at the Home Office and then at the Foreign Office in the American Department. In June 1945 at the end of the war she was posted to Chancery at the British Embassy in Washington. Grace travelled on a small plane with the Ambassador and one colleague across the Atlantic - an experience she never forgot.

She was a frequent visitor to the White House and she enjoyed the work and the very different lifestyle over the two years she stayed in America. She met some of the most important people of the war years.

Her return journey to England in 1947 was more comfortable than the outbound one. This time she crossed the Atlantic on the Queen Mary - also on board were Dwight Eisenhower and the actress Mary Martin with her young son Larry Hagman.

Grace met Bram at the Foreign Office in 1947 and they were married on 3 July 1948. They lived in Highbury, North London where their children, Bramwell and Ruth were born. Grace became a member of the Mothers' Union at St. John's Church, Highbury and Bramwell and Ruth received their primary education at St. John's Church of England School.

In 1964 the family moved to Shortlands and Grace confirmed her membership of the Mothers' Union at St. Mary's. Grace then trained as a teacher and was appointed to The Bishop Challoner, Roman Catholic Secondary School in Stepney, East London run by the Sisters of Mercy. She introduced Commerce and Economics into the curriculum and was promoted to Head of Department. She was at one time London Secretary of the Economics Association, becoming an Honorary member on her retirement in 1984.

Grace had two children, Ruth and Bram, four grandchildren and two great-granchildren. Her husband passed away in 2004 and in his memory the Holy Family Banner at St. Mary's was given.

She was a great correspondent and enjoyed the arrival of the post each morning. She was an inspiration to many. She still completed the Daily Telegraph crossword puzzle every morning - even on 2 June before she was taken ill.

A Service of Thanksgiving was held at St. Mary's Church prior to cremation at Beckenham. The service was conducted by Canon Paul Miller and The Roman Catholic Bishop of Lancaster, the Rt Rev Michael Campbell.


