The building project was completed at a cost of about £60,000 and will provide much needed facilities for the Church rooms.

Mission of the Month

Bromley Y is a long established local charity offering free, confidential counselling to young people and their families. They work with young people within the borough of Bromley from secondary school age up to twenty-three years. The service has been in operation for forty-five years supporting adolescents and young adults who are experiencing difficulties including low mood and depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, relationship difficulties and anger.

They are based in a discreet location in central Bromley but also work out of two outreach posts in Mottingham and Orpington for easier access to the community and also in twelve secondary schools in the borough. These are particularly valuable aspects of their service as being on site in various parts of Bromley enables them to respond to the need in all areas of the borough and often young people who would not be able to access our service otherwise.

They are an experienced team of qualified counsellors, family therapists, art therapists and volunteers who all have a passion for working with young people and supporting them through difficult periods of their lives.

God and Grass - Isn't THIS the truth!

GOD: Frank, you know all about gardens and nature. What in the world is going on down there on the planet? What happened to the dandelions, violets, thistle and stuff I started eons ago? Papal visit witnessed by Shortlands Resident

The words "historic occasion" are often over-used. But the Service of Evening Prayer in the presence of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI and His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, which took place in Westminster Abbey on Friday, 17 September, was genuinely such an occasion.

I was fortunate enough to receive an invitation, essentially because of my job and its location. I am the Chief Executive of the Supreme Court of the United Kingdom, which is located in the old Middlesex Guildhall on Parliament Square. The Supreme Court replaced the Appellate Committee of the House of Lords in October 2009. (For anyone who is confused if they look at the Court's website I should explain that I work under my maiden name). The working community in the buildings around Parliament



by Jenny Ellis...who was present at the historic service at which the Pope and Archbishop of Canterbury were present.

Square – principally ourselves, Westminster Abbey, the QEII Conference Centre and the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors, extend neighbourly invitations to each other for certain events.

The roads around the Abbey had been closed for some hours and, throughout the afternoon, large crowds gathered – some supportive and some definitely not: placards ranged from "We love you Papa" to "No Popery". Getting into the Abbey, even with a ticket, was not straightforward.

There were a number of notable aspects of the service, and the atmosphere in which it was held. The congregation was genuinely diverse in every sense of the word, and the range of religious leaders represented was striking. The ecumenical nature of the service came through in the prayers, the hymns, and the addresses given by both the Pope and the Archbishop. The involvement of a number of young people from both the Church of England Youth Council and two local Catholic Youth Services, in reading the prayers was very welcome.

One of the most moving parts of the service was the spontaneous clapping, started by those present in the Sacrarium and the Quire, when the Pope and the Archbishop exchanged the sign of peace. Those of us sitting in the Nave were able to see this and other parts of the service on large television screens which had been erected around the Abbey. A spontaneous wave of applause also accompanied the Pope and the Archbishop as they processed down the Nave at the end of the service.

When we emerged from the Abbey, it was getting dark. The whole area was still full of excited crowds and more Bishops and Cardinals than I have ever seen in one place before.

One of my colleagues was also present at the service, but in a working capacity. He previously worked in media relations for the Church of England. He had been asked to help manage some of the journalists attending the service. He had the unenviable task of supervising the Vatican press corps who were present when the Pope and the Archbishop were praying at the shrine of St. Edward the Confessor. They had received instructions as to the limited amount of time they were supposed to be filming, and Ben had been assiduously practising how to say politely in Italian "Please stop now". I gather, however, that the press proved to be rather a handful!
