

Proud of their Church and Proud of their School



Standing here before the door of St. Mary's Church are four members of the congregation. On the left is Pat Chase, deputy Churchwarden and leader of St. Mary's Pre-School. Beside her is Annette German, a member of St. Mary's choir, a retired teacher and grandmother of children at Highfield schools. Next in line is Brenda Vickers, a member of St. Mary's for almost fifty years. The Vicar's Vestry is a memorial to her husband Frank who died in 1990. Her son Richard is Parish Administrator. On the right is Peggy Smith, a very sprightly 94 year old. After the Sunday morning service she can be seen striding out along St. Mary's Avenue towards her home, having turned down any offer of a lift. She knows all about fitness and exercise, having had a long career as a physiotherapist.

These four women share an enthusiasm for the Shortlands community that centres on St. Mary's. However they have discovered another link: they were all pupils once upon a time at Haberdashers' Aske's Hatcham Girls' School at New Cross. Their school days stretch across half a century. Peggy started at Aske's in 1920 and she stayed for thirteen years. In those days Aske's was a private school, owned by the Haberdashers' Company of the City of London. In 1937, four years after Peggy left at eighteen, the eleven year old Brenda won a scholarship to Aske's. Her time there was sadly cut short by war. In September 1939 the school was evacuated to Hove. Brenda spent just ten days there with her friends. Her family circumstances meant that she was needed back home by her parents who were both

deaf. So she left Aske's and joined the Sacred Heart Convent at Honor Oak.

When Annette entered the school in 1949 it had recently been taken over by the London County Council, following the 1944 Education Act that opened the door to a good education for so many more children. Fees had been abolished and the Junior Department had dwindled to just nineteen children. Annette left in 1957 and Pat arrived, aged eleven, in 1964. Her school days lasted until 1971. Aske's remained a grammar school for another decade.

But in education things are always moving on. Following new government initiatives, Aske's was to become first a Comprehensive School, then a City Technology College. It is now a highly successful lead school of a Federation of Academies, which includes two

private schools. Indeed at present while their building undergoes refurbishment, a few hundred 3 to 11 year olds are with the 11 to 18s on the New Cross site. In a sense things will have come full circle. Peggy joined Aske's when she was five. Thirty years later in 1950 the Primary Department was phased out; but here it is back again in 2009.

A portrait of Robert Aske, who founded the school in 1690, hangs in the school hall. Once again he will be able to gaze down upon the pupils - or do we say *students* these days? - aged from 5 to 18, just as he did in Peggy's day. Even in education, it seems, what goes around comes around.

Remembering

Johan Aucamp

Johan, who lived in Celtic Avenue, was born in Molteno, one of the smallest communities in South Africa, in 1935. Sadly, his mother died on the same day he was born, and so he was brought up by his grandparents.

At school he was an exceptional student, and also excelled at athletics, setting a school record for the 440 yards which was not broken for 20 years. He read History and Economics at Stellenbosch University after which he moved to this country.

Here he met and married Janet. There are two sons of the marriage,

Peter and Jonny, and six grandchildren. Sadly Janet died in 2001.

Johan's business life led him eventually to set up a market research company. This enabled him to travel to many different countries and learn about their cultures.

His other interests were many and varied. They included a passion for music, opera, photography, sport, gardening, wine appreciation and the company of other people. In recent years he was particularly involved with the South Hill Woods Bowling Club and Royston School of which he was Chairman of Governors.

A large congregation came to St. Mary's, Shortlands to give thanks for Johan's life, before cremation at Beckenham. The service was conducted by Peter Stotesbury assisted by the Revd Jane Peters.

John Swatton

John was born in Newcastle upon Tyne. During the war he moved with his mother and sister to London. He was educated at Willesden County Grammar School.

He began his career training to be a Public Health Officer, firstly at Willesden Town Hall and then as a regular soldier in the army from where he had to be discharged following a serious motor bike accident. He went on to work for the Nestle organisation, then joined the GPO rising to management level where he oversaw several telephone directory enquiry exchanges. In his last years of working life he worked for Bromley Adult Education College training the unemployed.

He married Ann at St. Mary's Shortlands in 1961, the church where his four children, Lesley, Nick, Iain and

Duncan were to be baptised.

John became a councillor for the London Borough of Bromley, a school governor for over 30 years, a mason, a Rotarian and during his last year was Churchwarden at St. Mary's, where he also served on the P.C.C. and Friends of St. Mary's Committee and as a sidesman.

A private cremation at Beckenham Crematorium preceded a Service of Thanksgiving, conducted by Canon Paul Miller and the Reverend Jane Peters, at St. Mary's Shortlands where Ann, his wife, his four children and grandchildren were supported by a large congregation.

Sheila Douglas

Sheila was born in Aberdeen. She was an only child. In early childhood she moved with her parents to London. She was educated at Hampstead High School. Her profession was nursing.

In 1946 she married Paul - they were married for 63 years - living first in Putney, then Orpington and Petts Wood before settling in Shortlands.

Sheila was a member of the South Hill bowls club and a regular worshipper at St. Mary's Church where she was a regular in the Mothers' Union. Her interests included literature, the arts, and she was a painter too.

A Service of Thanksgiving, conducted by Canon Paul Miller, took place at Beckenham Crematorium, where friends and neighbours were there to support Paul, her husband, Jackie and Lesley, her daughters and her grandchildren.

Roy Baker

Roy was born in Wandsworth. He was one of four. He was educated at

school in London. For 50 years he worked for the Daily Mail working his way up from an office lad to the position of Placement Manager of the Advertising Department.

He married Gee in 1934, who herself was one of eight. From 1972 they settled in Shortlands.

His interests included photography, playing bridge and the National Trust.
