Harvest is here!

The community of Shortlands celebrates Harvest Festival on Sunday, 4 October with a Family and Parade Service and a Harvest Lunch. On the following Saturday there will be a Harvest Barn Dance.

So how did Harvest Festivals begin?

It seems pretty obvious to thank God for the harvest, but actually, it is a comparatively recent church service. Less than 200 years ago, harvest was not formally 'celebrated' in church, but in the taverns and on village greens of the countryside, with wild drinking and eating before the harshness of winter set in.

Then in 1834 an eccentric clergyman called the Rev Robert Stephen Hawker arrived in Morwenstowe, a tiny hamlet of a few farms perched high on the windswept cliffs of the north Cornish coast. The church had been without a vicar for years, but now Robert Hawker strode the lanes of Morwenstowe in a bright purple or red cassock.

Rural life in those days was harsh, and Hawker soon realised the sheer effort needed to survive in those parts. Harvest was the only thing that got people through the winter: a poor one meant starvation. Each bad year Hawker buried some of his congregation.

But the summer of 1843 was perfect, and the harvest that year was exceptionally bountiful. The people of Morwenstowe were getting set to celebrate with their usual abandon, when Hawker stepped in. Who, he asked, did they think had given them the harvest? Were they not going to even say 'thank you' to Him?

Abashed, the people came to church, and Hawker led them in giving thanks to God for his rich blessing upon them. The 'Christian' Harvest Festival had arrived – in Morwenstowe.

Nowadays Harvest Festivals are enjoyed by both regular

church-goers and visitors, making it one of the most popular services in the church year.

In Shortlands we, like many others, will thank God for all we have and the many people in the chain who help to provide what we have.

Our Harvest Lunch will consist very much of home grown vegetables as we have encouraged people this year to grow 'our own'!

Remembering

Paul Baker

Paul was born in South East London in 1913. He was one of four. He was educated at Merchant Taylors' School before joining the then well known builders Holland, Hannen and Cubitts. During World War Two he served as a Lieutenant Colonel in the Royal Engineers. After the War he became Secretary and then Director of International Paints and on retirement Bursar at St. Dunstan's College in Catford.

Paul was called to the Bar in 1949 and in the early 1950s was a Liberal Party parliamentary candidate for Dulwich. He was later Chairman of the London Liberal Party. In 1961 he was admitted as a Reader in the Church of England and also became a volunteer for the Abbeyfield Society receiving an MBE in 1986 for his services as Regional Secretary for Greater London.

Paul married Audrey in 1947 in the temporary church after the last St. Mary's church was destroyed in the War. They have lived in Shortlands all their married life. They had three children, who were all baptised at St. Mary's, Jonathan, Jane and Stephen

Paul's life and faith focussed on St. Mary's and especially the rebuilt church. Amongst his many contributions to its life, he was Churchwarden from 1973 - 1976, Treasurer of the Scout Group, president of the Friends of St. Mary's, served on the Parochial Church Council and was a member of the choir. In 1997 he wrote a book entitled 'lesus of Nazareth' which was published by Janus Publishing.

A Service of Thanksgiving was held at St. Mary's Church, conducted by Canon Paul Miller assisted by the Reverend Iane Peters. Ann Gimson and Peter Stotesbury, and attended by a large congregation. Members of his family and the church took part paying tribute to one of the great statesmen of our community. It was followed by a private cremation at Beckenham Crematorium.

Elsie Parks

Elsie was born in Paddington, London. She was the eighth of ten children. She went to work for J Lyons at the age of 16 and later at the Cumberland Hotel, Marble Arch.

She married Bill in 1940 at St. Mary's Cholsey, Oxfordshire, He was called up into the RAF where he served as a gunner in Bomber Command, surviving thirty three operational missions. They had two children, Anthony and Ann.

After the death of her husband at the age of 58, Elsie spent the last thirty years of her life in Beckenham and then Bromley, cared and looked after by her children until she went into Glebe Court Nursing Home, where she died at the age of 95 years.

Her funeral service at Beckenham Crematorium was conducted by Canon Paul Miller where Anthony and Ann were joined by family, friends and members of St. Mary's where Ann is Churchwarden.

As often happens, mums tend to step in to support their children's activities and Margaret and another mum sustained Susan's Brownie pack when it was in danger of closing down. Commissioned as Brown Owl she looked after the 10th Bromley Brownies from 1982 - 1994 and was for a time a District Comissioner.

Whilst Susan was busy at school, Margaret used her spare time with voluntary activities, amongst which were meals on wheels, the Hayes School Stationery Shop and the Red Cross Medical Loan facility, but when Susan had left school Margaret wanted another challenge. She went to work at Westmorland Road Post Office in 1983. Always good at mental arithmetic, she enjoyed the counter work as well as the anticipated excitement of the weekly cash balance! Margaret enjoyed gardening, wildlife, crosswords, jigsaw puzzles and reading detective stories especially those by Agatha Christie and Ruth Rendell.

Accessible Toilet Project Update

Many parishioners are concerned that worshippers in the Church or visitors to Church House activities who have disabilities might be put off coming if they felt they could not use the toilet if they needed it. Whilst there are accessible toilets in the Church Hall they require a round trip outside of two hundred yards - hardly dignified, practical in winter, or helpful if caught short.

£37,000 has already been raised from last year's Gift Day, bequests, and fundraising activities by groups and individuals within the Parish to whom we are enormously grateful.

The total cost of £60,000 seems an awful lot for a toilet, but the nature of the build (two actual toilets, a wash basin and baby changing facilities) is space hungry and cannot be located within Church House as it stands with partitioning – we have to construct walls and a roof. Hence the expense.

We are submitting funding applications to charitable bodies whose charters enable them to make donations to initiatives of this kind.

However, we still depend principally on the parish to support this worthwhile cause. A number of fundraising initiatives will be launched in the autumn.

When will it be built? As soon as we have the money! We plan to build in the summer of 2010.

Guides' Summer Camp 2009

The Guides' Summer Camp was held at Thriftwood Scout Activity Centre at Brentwood in Essex. The theme of the camp was Ice Age 3 – Dawn of the Dinosaurs, so the patrols were named after different dinosaurs: Triceratops, Diplodocus, Stegosaurus, Pterodactyl, Ankylosaurus & Brontosaurus.


A wide range of activities were enjoyed by the Guides, many of which were based on and around the campsite lake: canoeing, kayaking, rafting, water zorbing (like a giant inflatable hamster ball) plus "Water Splash" – an afternoon of wet and wild activities for all groups camping at Thriftwood.

On dry land (when it wasn't raining!) were pedal karting, cresta toboggan run, ice climbing, trampolining, Sky High walk (high ropes), 3D maze, Demolition Derby, plus many more besides.

Canon Paul came to visit the Guides on Monday, which was Good Turn Day – each person draws a name out of the hat at breakfast time, and has to do a secret Good Turn for that person during the day. At evening around the camp fire, each person has to guess who did them a Good Turn and what it was. The results are sometimes surprising – some Good Turns go unnoticed, and many small kindnesses are noticed and appreciated even though they weren't intended as a Good Turn.

Each day the tents and patrol kitchens are inspected by the Young Leaders, who enjoy this job as they were on the receiving end in previous years as PLs! Coloured ribbons ranging from red (excellent) to black (awful) are awarded each evening and points given to find the best overall patrol in camp. Canon Paul accompanied YLs on their tour of inspection, and reported back that the tents varied from "OK" to "awful" - the Guides had obviously been too busy working on their Good Turns to tidy the tents that day!







Happiness just outside the door

Such is the verdict of a recent National Trust Survey. It found that two thirds of us are much happier when we potter in our gardens than when we watch the telly or even shop.

Alan Titchmarsh, the well known TV gardener, is delighted. "The message is clear. If you want to feel better, get out into a garden. Never has access to a garden been more important for our spiritual and physical wellbeing than in today's rapidly changing landscape."

The National Trust is calling for more green space to be made available, through allotments on public land, around offices and by reclaiming derelict land. It estimates that there are 600 acres of space available on window boxes alone
