Six new ways to get married in church

Couples planning to marry after 1 October 2008 will have the freedom to marry in a church where they have a family or other connection. Under a relaxation of the rules, they will not have to be living in the parish, which will enable many more couples to marry in their favoured church. The Church of England Marriage Measure was approved by the General Synod last July, and completed its parliamentary process in April. Simon Hughes MP, who supported the Measure, told the House of Commons that, in an age that bemoaned the loss of community and the difficulty of maintaining roots, "more people will be likely to be married in churches because they will be able to marry in those that they think are important or valuable. That will be a good thing for the Church, for couples, and their families, who will feel more involved in the process."

Existing law is based on right of residency, allowing a couple to marry in the parish where one or both of

them live, whether they are baptised or not and whether they are churchgoers or not. Marrying elsewhere has required a special licence or six months' of regular attendance, followed by entry on the church electoral roll. These options remain. But couples now need to fulfil just one of six criteria. They can marry in a parish church if one of them was baptised or confirmed there, if one of them has ever lived in the parish for six months or more; or if one of them has at any time regularly attended public worship there for six months or more. A family connection opens up further possibilities, adding the right to marry in a parish if one of the parents has lived for six months or more in the child's lifetime, or has regularly attended worship there in the child's lifetime. Couples can also marry in a parish where their parents or grandparents were married.

One of the first couples in Shortlands to act on the changes are Neil Lambert and Christina Stokes.

They live in Edinburgh but wish to be married at St. Mary's Shortlands, the parish in which Christina's parents live. Charles Stokes, Christina's father commented: "Our daughter moved with us from Chislehurst to Shortlands when she was 13 and even though she is now 27 and has lived in Oxford, Cardiff and Edinburgh since she went to University and started to make her own way in the world, Shortlands is where she sees the family home and Shortlands is where she wants to be married. This notwithstanding there will be a posse from Scotland and Newcastle-upon-Tyne, where her fiancé's home is, descending on the day. Having not lived in the parish for so long, this would have been much harder had it not been for the Church of England's new regulations."

The Measure has been almost ten years in the making. The Dean of Wakefield, the Very Revd. George Nairn-Briggs, who chaired the steering committee, said it would

meet a real pastoral need. He described the list of connections as "simple and user-friendly" when the Measure returned to the Synod in July, and promised that it would be supplemented by "equally user-friendly guidance from the House of Bishops".

From 5 June, clergy can now access those guidelines at the Church of England website. Implementing the existing law has caused some anguish in the past, most recently in Shere in Surrey, where the Rector, the Revd. Charles Lawrence, came under criticism from parishioners for observing the residency rules.

The Bishop of St. Edmundsbury & Ipswich, the Rt. Revd. Nigel Stock, was on the steering committee for the Measure. He said: "Research does show that more people would like to marry in church than actually do. I hope this new law will make it much easier for clergy to say 'yes' to couples when they first enquire."

The thread of God's love

In 563 an Irish monk was forced to leave his homeland because of a conflict that had led to a misuse of power and even bloodshed. On Pentecost Sunday he arrived on the island of Iona off the north-west coast of Scotland with twelve companions. There he began a new way of life founded on Christ's mercy and forgiveness of the past, and so created one of the great centres of faith and mission in the Christian Church. His name was Columba, and we keep his feast day on 9 June.

His monastery on Iona started as a small cluster of wooden buildings with a church and a guesthouse. Around were fields of crops and cattle and bees. But under Columba's guidance, it grew, and from Iona monks were sent into Scotland as one arm of a missionary advance that reached down through England to

France and across Europe.

That outreach was an amazing achievement. But just as amazing was the consolidation of monastic life on Iona that resulted two centuries later in the Book of Kells. This text of the four Gospels was begun by scribes and artists in the library of Iona. It grew into one of the masterpieces of Celtic art that was taken to Kells in Ireland to escape the Viking invaders who ravaged the island.

Along with the text of the Gospels, there are illustrations of Jesus, Mary and the four evangelists, together with decorations at once intricate and fantastic: patterns that interweave and interlace across the page with an odd face here and a weird creature there.

The design is in brilliant detail, and you can follow the lines as they weave in and out. This delight in

patterns is evident in lots of Celtic art. It is good to imagine Columba on Iona meditating on the thread of God's grace woven into his life as he looked back to his years in Ireland and his pilgrimage to Iona. It might have seemed at one glance a complicated interweaving of events and experiences, and then perhaps as he looked again, he would see God's love threading its way through that history and redeeming both it and him.

It is the same for us. As we look at our lives, they may seem complex and involved with patterns of events and circumstances taking us here and

there. As we ponder those patterns, then we can begin to see a thread woven into the patterns that guide and lead us on. And as we stand back, all the patterns and threads seem to make sense as we spot that guiding thread.

The vicar went to the bank and asked for a statement of his account, adding: "We want to know how far afield we can go for our holiday." Handing him his statement the cashier enquired very gently: "Have you got a field at the back of your garden, sir?"
