David Loades

a young age after which he never lived more than three miles away!

His early childhood was shaped by the second world war – hearing spitfires from Biggin Hill and spending nights under the stairs or in the bomb shelter. He was evacuated to Nottingham where he was separated from his brother and sister: an early experience that shaped his outlook on life and the importance of family to him.

David enjoyed school - his interest in maths, physics, art and woodwork remained throughout his life, linking a logical mind with creative expression. He was active and sporty, becoming Vice Captain for the school rugby team and continuing through to Old Beccehamians at Sparrows Den.

Scouting was a huge and defining part of his life. He started as a young wolf cub, became a Warranted Scout Leader at 18, later Scout Leader at St Mary's with the 7th Bromley Troop and Group Scout Leader. He was passionate about the opportunities that scouting offers.

David was a Civil Service 'lifer' – having joined from school, he served in the Government Actuary's Department for 40 years, completing his career as the Deputy Government Actuary. He was the epitome of a professional civil servant and was awarded the CB (Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath) for services to the Government Actuary's Department.

He met Jenny, the love of his life, at a dance for the nurses at Cheyne Hospital, West Wickham. They had three children, Philippa, Stephen and Christine, and four grandchildren who were very special to them. He was a compassionate and tireless carer for Jenny: a true expression of their deep love for each other.

Church was important to him and he was a member of St Mary's congregation for fifty years. He enjoyed thought-provoking Home Group discussions, listening to the Music Group and the support and welcome of the 2WWs once he was widowed.

David lived a rich and fulfilled life and will be much missed.

During my first couple of terms I have really enjoyed getting to know the children, staff and families that make up our school community and appreciate how welcoming everyone has been.



As well as loving an engaging academic curriculum, I am really pleased that children at Highfield have opportunities to excel and enjoy a range of different learning activities; music and sport are particular strengths. Since January, the choirs have performed twice at Langley Park School for Boys and sung alongside the Yale Glee Club as they travelled to Oxford University. Mission of the month

Demelza Hospice Care for Children

Demelza looks after children and young adults up to 19 years old with life limiting illnesses and their families in two residential hospices, Demelza Kent in Sittingbourne and Demelza South East London in Eltham. Demelza nurses also go directly into the children's homes offering a hospice at home service with Demelza Community in East Sussex

Demelza offers support at diagnosis, symptom management, respite care, therapies, sibling and family support as well as end of life care and bereavement support.

In Sittingbourne there are now ten bedrooms and six bathrooms. Two of the bedrooms have ensuite facilities specifically for teenagers, which have recently been upgraded. Facilities include a music room, an art room, a sensory room, a soft play area and a Hydrotherapy Pool. There is now a cinema room and computer/games consoles available and use of Eye gaze (eye-driven) technology. There are large grounds with quiet reflective areas and a large pirate ship playground.

In Eltham there are 6 bedrooms, all with ensuite bathrooms, a music/sensory room, a wet play/art room, a family room, networked computers for family use and a small outdoor playground.

Care is taken into the home by Demelza Community to give families a break without having to travel. This enables children and young people with terminal conditions to have specialist care in familiar surroundings. As a result, families are given more flexibility and helped to retain a sense of control and independence. They can also access both hospices.

St Mary's Church has supported this wonderful charity since its inception in 1994 (the first Hospice in Sittingbourne was opened in 1998) and has continued to support the charity in its aim to help life limited children and their families live life to the full. Demelza Hospice Care for Children is grateful for all the support that has been given over the years by the people of St. Mary's.

Local places to visit: Church House Gardens

Did you know that the gardens behind the library in Bromley High Street are made up of two originally distinct houses and gardens? They stretch from the library to Mill Lane and from Church Road to Ethelbert Road, consisting of upper and lower gardens on a steeply sloping site down to the River Ravensbourne.

The gardens are delightful and some of the winding paths and terraces can provide a strenuous workout for the unwary or the health conscious! All ages are catered for: the children's playground, with super slides, offers respite for families from the hustle and bustle of the shops. There are tennis courts and a skateboard/ scooter/ BMX bike park for the sports-minded. So how did we end up with such a lovely park in easy reach and en route to the High Street?

The 18th century rectory to the parish church of St. Peter and St. Paul was re-built in 1832. The new house and grounds off Church Road were leased to Abel Moysey who began a programme of improvement to the grounds. After he died it was tenanted for fifty years, then Aldred Henwood acquired it in 1889. He and then his widow lived in it until 1926 when Bromley Council purchased it.

Number 16 High Street was a large house with gardens adjoining the Church House gardens. In 1850 it was bought by George Sparkes who had served as a judge in the Indian civil service. He named the house Neelgherries, after the hills of Nilgiris in India, of which the views across Bromley were said to be reminiscent. He later enlarged his property by buying number 17 High Street. The house and grounds were left to Bromley Council in 1900 by George's widow, to be used for education and learning. Thanks to a gift of £7,500 from Andrew Carnegie in 1906 a new library was erected on the site.

In 1926 the two gardens were merged into one. Unfortunately, Church House and the parish church were destroyed by an air raid in 1941. In the 1970s the new Churchill library and theatre complex were completed. Things may change again in the foreseeable future with plans for redeveloping the immediate area around the gardens.

Two remarkable sisters

The book is the story of two remarkable Irish sisters, Edith and Florence Stoney. They both came to England in the 1890s for their higher education since this was not possible in Ireland at that time. Florence became a doctor and was a student at the London School of Medicine for Women, and Edith read physics at Cambridge. Edith became the first female medical physicist, and Florence the first female radiologist.

Their young professional lives are inspiring, and both were involved in the suffrage movement. Both served in the Great War with distinction, and made dramatic and significant contributions.

The book would make a great film, and I have always seen Kate Winslet as playing Florence. I had a wonderful time some years ago on Woman's Hour when I had an interesting conversation with Jenni Murray about Florence!

The book is published by Springer (£32.99) and an e-book is also available: ISBN 978-3-030-16560-4.


