We are very pleased to welcome the Revd. Jane Kustner who is standing in for Revd. Gary for a few weeks and leading most of the services at St Mary's through December and over the Christmas period. We are also grateful to Archdeacon Paul Wright and Revd Jane Peters who will be leading some of our services.

Revd Jane Kustner was recently the Chaplain at a residential home for clergy for a couple of years, and prior to that was priest in charge of a church in a relocation area in KZN, South Africa. Before that she was priest in charge of a church in Hither Green for 8 years and Area Dean for East Lewisham during that time. We look forward to getting to know Jane better while she is with us at St Mary's.

Future Generations Project

In November the PCC approved in principle the proposal to update the heating system in church by installing underfloor heating with new flooring and with moveable seating to allow more flexible use of the building. These changes are estimated to cost around £275,000, of which over £120,000 has already been raised.

The Group will now move forward with fund raising and will also prepare specifications to enable detailed costs to be obtained. On Retreat

Last month Jan Boam and I took a trip to the Yorkshire Dales for a retreat entitled "Advent with the Celtic Saints". So what were the highlights? Well the main highlight for me occurred even before our arrival at Scargill House. The sunset as we drove northwest over the Yorkshire moors to Grassington was absolutely stunning. It lasted for about 45 minutes and became more beautiful as it went on. I've never seen the northern lights but this would definitely be a rival. The second highlight was a music workshop led by the chaplain at Scargill who had been a professional singer with Opera North prior to ordination. It took place in the chapel, we had no music or words to look at. We listened, copied, sang in a round, in harmonies, without instruments and in tune! It was quite wonderful.

So what were the sessions like? We didn't learn much about the Celtic Saints individually, it was more to do with their practical way of travelling and spreading the gospel. The main message was to **do** something and do little things well. There is no secular/spiritual divide in Celtic spirituality, our faith should be part of us always, *Be strong and courageous for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go* Joshua 1 v9. God can be met in the sunset, in music, and walking in the drizzle up to Connie Pie (a limestone outcrop).
