# Time to celebrate

Celebration is something that at St Mary's we do best with cake. In May, as a church we celebrated our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of being twinned with Douai in France, my licensing as Vicar, VE Day and all that has happened in the life of the church in the past year at our Annual Parochial Church Meeting. There has been celebrating around the world too, with many Christians giving thanks to God for the life of Pope Francis and then for the announcement of Pope Leo XIV.

Often, celebrations can bring with them mixed emotions. As we celebrate, we often wonder what could have been, thinking about people we may wish were alongside us but are no longer, we remember events we wish had gone differently.

As we celebrated VE Day, we remembered all those who lost their lives in that horrific conflict. We remembered that war is still in our world and with it comes a terrible cost for those affected by it. We pray for them, and we hold onto hope that peace will reign. It can be easy to live fixated on all the hurt and pain in the world and lose hope. It can also be easy to ignore it all and just focus on what brings us happiness. I believe we are called to live in the tension of the two: to celebrate the good in our lives and the world, whilst remembering the world is not perfect, holding onto hope and doing what we can to help it become the world it was created to be.

At St Mary's we try to hold this tension in all that we do as we believe there is always hope with God. On Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, remembering the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus. It is sometimes thought of as the Church's birthday, signifying the beginning of the Church's mission to the world.

It is a celebration for Christians: a sign that God is with us now and a vital reminder that Christianity is not only for a specific people but for everyone and all are welcome. You are always welcome at St Mary's. So, this month, what are you giving thanks for and celebrating?

During the service, the ministry team joined in prayers for Revd Dave's ministry in Shortlands.

#### **Looking forward – and thank you!**

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting, held on 11th May, was chaired by Revd Dave Edmondson: a busy day for him as he had just presided over his first Sunday service at St Mary's.

In his report he said that he was 'bowled over' by his installation service and he and his family were thankful for the warm welcome they had received: they are looking forward to being part of the community.

He said that God had been at work in this church and parish during the Interregnum (the period when the church was without a vicar), and that he was excited for the future of St Mary's. He thanked the many people who had been active in the church during the Interregnum.

The current churchwardens, Glo Sherman and Robin Hogg, were reappointed for the next year, with thanks for all their work in the previous year. Jay Sharma was thanked for her work as Secretary to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and Helen Bird was appointed in her place.

Thanks were also given to the outgoing members of the PCC, and three new members were elected: Toks Taylor, Suzie Evans and Julie Fox.

Tim Dawson, the Treasurer, emphasised the need to increase income as a loss on unrestricted income was recorded last year. He highlighted a generous donation towards installing a new servery at the back of church and thanked everyone who gives sacrificially towards the life of St Mary's.

#### Things to look out for in the summer



Thinking back to when I first moved to Bromley in the early 1980s, the sights and sounds that defined summer have changed a lot, perhaps not for the better. Gone are the screaming groups of swifts that appeared with the emergence of the flying ants, the raucous flocks of starlings with their youngsters feeding on the lawn, the wheezing call of greenfinches and the memorable moment of freeing a bullfinch from the netting over my ripening strawberries.

Pleasant though nostalgia is, it shouldn't be over-indulged. We are fortunate to live in a borough that has more green space than many. Swifts still cling on, and our green spaces, whether our gardens or municipal, have much else to offer in summer.

One of the most positive developments in recent years has been the encouragement of gardeners and councils to mow and tidy a bit less, and let nature have a bit more elbow room. I now leave two substantial patches in the lawn to grow as they will, from spring to late autumn. The results have been dramatic.

Early summer brings lots of white oxeye daisies and wild violets, followed later by yellow bird's foot trefoil and increasingly, common spotted orchids! Who would have thought that those might be lurking unsuspected in an 'unimproved' suburban lawn? The longer grass is appreciated by the birds, who find more insects and then seeds later. It is also appreciated by butterflies, especially the Meadow Brown and Gatekeeper, which have become welcome visitors in the garden.

The same principle has been applied at South Hill Wood, where an area near the electricity substation is left for meadow and insect friendly plants to grow as they will. It has proved popular with a variety of insects and butterflies including more unusual ones such as the Marbled White butterfly. I recommend it on a warm summer's day, and there is a most welcoming bench nearby!

#### MISSION OF THE MONTH

#### Welcare

Welcare is a family support charity working with families and children up to the age of 13 in Bromley, South London and East Surrey. Its services are dedicated to bringing support to those whose joys of childhood and raising children are constrained by social isolation, domestic abuse, financial hardship or disadvantage.

The focus of the charity's work is to provide practical and emotional support and advice, individual one-to-one work and group work programmes, supervised by senior social workers. They work alongside parents and carers helping them use their strengths and skills to nurture secure and confident children.

Welcare runs programmes such as Caring Dads: a group for fathers which aims to increase men's awareness of abusive or neglectful behaviour and to enable them to take responsibility for their actions. Capability in Schools is an early intervention group work programme delivered in schools for children with emerging social and emotional support needs.

There are parenting support groups that help parents to understand their children's behaviour and become positive and confident in their parenting, and Recovery from Domestic Abuse, a group for children and their non-abusive parent.

Welcare's services are driven by Christian values, and it works with those of all faiths and none; its sole aim is to help those in greatest need.
