

What goes up

The next major Christian festival is Ascension Day, celebrating the ascension of the resurrected Jesus to heaven. At St Mary's we will celebrate this at 8pm on Thursday 26 May.

There is a saying 'What goes up, must come down'. Although this might not apply to the cost of living and fuel prices, we believe it does apply to Jesus. We often stop the narrative immediately after the actual ascension, but the next verse in the Bible re-assures us that Jesus will return.

Jesus' return ties in with the vision of God returning to rule directly on earth that is found in the last chapters of both the prophet Isaiah, in the Old Testament, and the book of Revelation, at the end of the New Testament. Both passages describe a renewed creation. Isaiah speaks of the absence of 'the sound of weeping' and infant mortality; of a world without exploitation, where creation is back in harmony with itself and with people. The book of Revelation speaks of God 'wiping every tear from people's eyes' and 'where mourning and crying and pain will be no more'.

For me these often-ignored references to Jesus coming back to reign on earth and ushering in a New Heaven and a New Earth, are at the heart of God's purposes and, in turn, give purpose to my life. We need to work to protect the environment and stop the exploitation of the earth's resources and the damage that is being caused through climate change. We also need to challenge the exploitation of people, countries and people groups and work towards trying to make this world, and our own communities, kinder, more caring places.

We are not called to stare at the heavens awaiting Jesus' return. We do need to continually look to Jesus, to remind ourselves of his purposes and our part within them, as we also look at God's world and discover what we should be doing to help prepare the ground for the New Creation that Jesus will usher in on his return.

Alf Cobley

Alfred Cobley was born in 1927, in Westminster. During World War II Alf was evacuated to Pease Pottage and very much enjoyed his time in the countryside.

After the war he carried out his National Service and joined the Royal Navy. He sailed to Australia and was involved with bringing back war brides to the UK. After his National Service he was employed in the local council's stores department.

Alf met Joan and after a courtship they married in 1951 at the Church of St Gabriel's, Warwick Square. They moved into a flat in Pimlico: Alf's parents were living next door.

Joan and Alf enjoyed their trips to Hastings to visit family. When they moved to their last home, a lovely bungalow in Shortlands, they spent many years rehoming a number of cats, which took over the house, plus their little dog.

When Joan passed away in 2014 Alf's health deteriorated and his mobility was greatly reduced. He was very fond of his neighbours who provided both company and help.

Alf regularly received Holy Communion at home from St Mary's.

As he always wanted, Alf stayed in his home to the very end. He very much missed Joan and it's nice to think they will be reunited again at the garden of rest.



On parade

St Mary's church welcomes all of the uniformed organisations associated with the parish at parade services at four special times of the year: Mothering Sunday, the day of the Parish Picnic, Harvest Festival and Remembrance Sunday.

With heads held high and looking so smart in their uniforms, the young people parade down the aisle bearing flags which are placed either side of the high altar for the duration of the service. The flag bearer and two supporters then take up positions in the front pews, alongside other members of their groups and their leaders. At the close of the service, they collect the flags and parade back down the aisle to be formally dismissed outside.

St Mary's is the patron of the 7th Bromley Scout Group, whose members – Beavers, Cubs and Scouts - meet in its grounds. The Scout law mentions 'Duty to God and Queen': whichever god members of the movement recognise, the parade service is acknowledged as showing respect and an honour for members to attend.

The Girlguiding units - Rainbows, Brownies & Guides - are also very much part of St Mary's and hold their weekly meetings in the Church Hall. Each year the Guides do a good turn for the church by clearing dead leaves from church gardens after their Christmas sleepover.

This year Friday Guides have clocked up two firsts - helping make Christingles for the Christingle service, and posies for Mothering Sunday.



Community news

Shortlands Residents' Association (SRA) held their Annual General Meeting on 5th April. At the beginning, one minute's silence was held to remember Councillor Mary Cooke.

Mark Dempsey stood down as Chair of the SRA, having served on the committee for more than 10 years.

Various local items were discussed:

- Proposals for 87 Beckenham Lane (the building behind the hoardings in Shortlands Village);
- Lifts to be installed at Shortlands Station (there is local concern about the height of the two lift towers);
- Planning proposals for Bromley Town Centre;
- Improving the Shortlands Station road junction for pedestrians (any scheme has to be approved by Transport for London);
- Commuter parking, gutter and gully cleaning and litter.

Christian Aid

In May each year St Mary's supports Christian Aid, a charity that works to alleviate poverty and give practical support to communities in some of the poorest countries in the world. The needs are no less now than when Christian Aid was founded in 1945. For the first time in a generation global poverty is rising due to the combined effects of coronavirus, conflict and the climate crisis.



The Christian Aid Week 2022 appeal focuses on Zimbabwe where the climate crisis has brought intense droughts that have left the land barren. With no rain, people can't grow enough food, and women struggle to provide for their children. In times of drought, many families can only afford to eat one bowl of porridge a day. Mothers often skip meals to share with their children what little food they have.

Your donation could help a family in Zimbabwe to grow drought-resistant crops, to set up a water tap on their farm, and learn how to grow food in the harsh climate. You can help to turn dry, dusty land into a garden of hope.
