

The Fruit of the Spirit

I was surprised recently to discover how many people, young and old, had not heard the phrase 'the Fruit of the Spirit', or even where the phrase came from. Do you know?

Answers I received ranged from, 'bananas and oranges and stuff like that', to 'my Nan's fruit bowl', to 'a new craft gin'. Whether these answers are appropriate or not, they are not quite what I had in mind or, to be more accurate, what the Apostle Paul had in mind when he wrote about the Fruit of the Spirit to the people of Galatia (modern day Turkey) in the 1st Century.

At this time the people of Galatia had experienced a new freedom in living out their lives as Christians, but this did not give them a licence to do, say or think bad things. However, they had lost some self-control and were going back to old ways and habits and not following the positive teachings of Jesus Christ.

So, the Apostle Paul reminded them that they should not be living their lives in a bad way but should be accepting that there were better ways to live, especially through acceptance of the Fruit of the Spirit: 'but the fruit of the Spirit is **love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control**. Against such things there is no law' (found in the New Testament, Galatians 5: 23).

Just look at those words. Tell me if you see anything wrong with any of them. Each word reminds us of a way to live and behave, and I believe that, if you accept one of the words, the rest will naturally follow.

The theme of the Fruit of the Spirit has been used for our new monthly event, Tea Time Together, where we will be exploring each word through music, dance, arts and crafts and lots of fun. These words are not just a foundation for the young people in how they live their lives, but also for each of us. As grown-ups I believe we would do no wrong by writing these words down and placing them in a prominent position at home so that we can be reminded of these basic principles of living our lives.

Join in the fun!

We welcome Rachel Tillotson as the new Junior Church Leader, a role that leads on developing church for young people and families.

Each week, Junior Church will focus on stories from the bible through learning and activities, all carried out in a fun way. Also, over the coming weeks, Junior Church will be preparing for the Harvest Family Service on 10 October, along with planning for Remembrance Sunday, taking place on 14 November.

Why not come along to the Community Open Day being held at St. Mary's on 9th October, where you will be able to meet some of the team, enjoy some fun activities, including food-based activities, but also get to know more about Junior Church.

Already, Rachel has begun a new initiative, Tea Time Together, a themed afternoon of music, arts and crafts and lots of fun – with free refreshments at the Community Café. We hope you can join us on 3rd October from 4.00 to 5.30pm – and look out for future dates.

This will now go to the Friends of Downe, a newly formed charity actively pursuing a strong fundraising campaign to complete the purchase of this historic site. It has provided so much fun for thousands of youngsters over many decades: their participation has been life affirming and should be for future generations too.

A generous response

Watching the situation unfold in Afghanistan and seeing images of people fleeing for their lives led St Mary's to respond by appealing for donations and acting as a local collection point for refugees arriving in London with no more than the clothes they stood up in.

More than six full car-loads of emergency supplies from St Mary's, as well as financial support, have been sent to the Lewisham Donation Hub, which has stepped up and supported the refugees in quarantine in hotels all around London with basic necessities such as suitcases, toiletries, nappies, underwear, children's toys and baby food.

As the refugees settle in new accommodation further appeals are likely but, in the meantime, we would like to thank anyone who contributed so quickly for their overwhelming generosity.

MISSION OF THE MONTH

St Christopher's Hospice

Founded in 1967 by Dame Cicely Saunders, St Christopher's Hospice exists to promote and provide skilled and compassionate palliative care of the highest quality. Their vision is of a world in which all dying people and those close to them have access to the care and support they need, when and wherever they need it. They believe each person is unique and they tailor care to meet social, emotional and spiritual needs, as well as manage physical symptoms.

The hospice has been a centre of education, innovation and insight ever since its foundation. The Group now consists of St Christopher's Hospice in Sydenham and St. Christopher's Bromley, which is based in Orpington.

Every year St Christopher's provide care and support to over 6,500 people across five London Boroughs both at home and in the hospices. It costs £23m a year to run their services, £15m of which has to be found by fundraising.
