

Ann was born in 1946 and grew up in Paddington. She did well at school, after which she was employed by the International Wool Secretariat (IWS) in Pall Mall where she worked as a PA for 25 years. It was a very sociable place to work and she made friendships which lasted many years.

In 1979 she moved to Bromley and later became part of St Mary's congregation, cheerfully participating in its many activities. She became a deputy Church Warden and then Church Warden. Always in church in more than good time, Ann was never without her little notebook and pen: things were to be done 'just so' and to be 'just right'. There was a very orderly mind behind that notebook.

After a long career at IWS, Ann decided to ditch the commuting and work locally. She joined the curtain department in Allders department store in Bromley (where Primark is now), where her people skills made her a gifted saleswoman and customers frequently sought her out to help them. When Allders closed she briefly worked at Primark, but it wasn't quite the right fit for her so she decided to leave the world of work behind her.

Ann embraced her retirement, which opened up new joys for her. She poured her energy into her garden and she travelled widely, enjoying long cruises where she was quick to make new friends. She also gave her time generously to support a friend with fundraising work for Bromley MIND. She had a gift for connecting with people, and as her beloved brother Anthony once said: 'Ann, people are your oxygen'.

Ann had a natural elegance and her Marilyn Monroe-like hair was often commented on. Kind, considerate, helpful and thoughtful, she also loved the finer things in life, often popping up to London for lunch or afternoon tea with friends. She was a very special person and we at St Mary's are grateful for her many years of service and friendship.

Things to look out for in autumn



Autumn is by tradition a season of plenty for humans and wildlife, the hedgerows and woods bursting with berries and seeds of all kinds. However, we have had such a strange summer with serious drought and high temperatures: autumn has started early, leaves are yellowing and falling and ripe berries are on some of the bushes. Others have failed to produce their usual abundance: blackberries have shrivelled for lack of water, and early apples are small and hard.

This will have a knock-on effect on the wildlife that depends on them to provide full bellies before the cold comes and winter comforts when it does. What ripe berries there are will be eaten early and when our winter visitors, the redwings and the fieldfares, come they may find little has been left for them.

Some things don't change: rain, when it comes in quantity, will bring the fungi to our woods in all their bizarre glory. Ivy flowers will provide late nectar for bees, wasps and late butterflies, and ivy berries after Christmas, to the delight of the birds.

If you take a walk in South Hill Wood, or further afield, look for fungi: quite a few different sorts pop up there. Redwings will appear in October and stay for a while if there are the holly berries that they love. The wood doesn't ever fall silent, unless, maybe, it snows.

Autumn and winter bird songs are different. The robin takes centre stage, with a distinctive seasonal song: he also makes that strange ticking call a lot. These are territorial sounds, warning strangers that there is a resident robin and he will defend his space. In autumn large numbers of robins, blackbirds and song thrushes arrive from Scandinavia and Northern Europe, in search of a warmer winter. Our resident birds must work hard to defend their local patch with songs and sharp calls.
